Dear members,

This activity report provides information about everything that has taken place during the 2013/14 season. This was a season of contrasts and one marked by a series of negative incidents, many not sports-related and some that we will never be able to forget. As these events all occurred practically at the same time, it became difficult to manage the Governing Board over which I have the honour to preside.

In the space of very few months certain situations arose that put our institution to the test: the departure of the president Sandro Rosell, the court cases of Messi and Neymar, sanctions by FIFA, provisionally postponed, Víctor Valdés's unfortunate injury and the departure of the captain Carles Puyol, to name a few. And lastly, the worst of all news, the passing away of Tito Vilanova, an irreparable loss that united all Barça fans.

If FC Barcelona managed to overcome all these unfortunate episodes in these few months it was only possible due to the institution's maturity and the extraordinary fortitude of its members. Undoubtedly, Barça is now stronger than ever before.

The sporting results of the season have been brilliant in all professional sections with a total of 14 titles, the highest number ever for this sections. The last, the ACB league, was won against Madrid amid enthusiastic support from a packed Palau. Another highlight is Barça B, Juvenil and the youth teams, who had the best year to date. Yet the season was clouded by the fact that the first football team did not manage to obtain the desired results, despite fighting hard right to the end.

The Club is enjoying an extraordinarily healthy membership base, with 153,458 members, 1,267 fan clubs and 130 million followers on social media. A great demonstration of the force of our members was the massive approval in a referendum of the New Espai Barça. The Espai Barça will be the home to Barcelonism for the next 50 years as well as boosting our heritage.

The completion of the membership list update and the reform of our Statutes has modernised and reinforced our uniqueness as a club.

We are giving the Club a healthy set of finances by reducing debt. For the third financial year running we have consolidated gain and achieved record income thanks to the extraordinary potential of the Barça brand.

The Governing Board, however, is aware that neither sporting success nor healthy finances are enough to make Barça a model institution. We therefore need satisfied members who are strong, proud of belonging to Barça and all it represents and who know that the club belongs to its members; they feel welcomed, they are involved in important decisions that affect our future and they can take an active role in the life of the institution.

We need to look to the future and approach all our goals for the next two years with high hopes. We have a clear road map. I want to transform Barça. I want to make it more effective. And to do this I want to enhance the sports, managerial and executive areas.

Members of FC Barcelona, let's leave this chapter behind us: we know we have to improve and that we are now ready to face the future with determination and wisdom, applying the necessary tools to improve management of the Institution and tackle the sporting, financial, social and patrimonial challenges ahead to ensure that Barça remains the best club in the world.

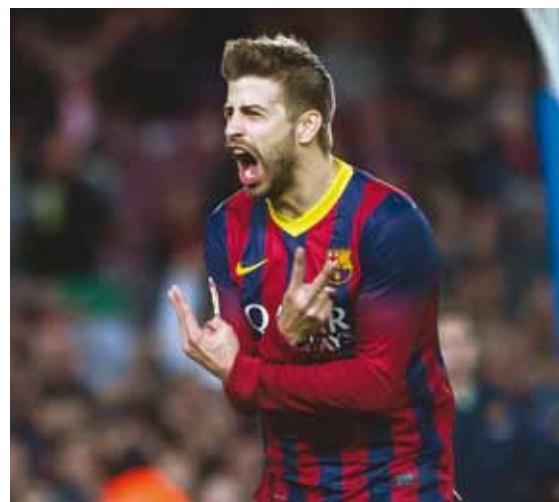
The league eludes us in the last match

EFC Barcelona was unable to reclaim the League title won last season 2013/14 after a closely fought battle with Atlético de Madrid and Real Madrid that went on until the last moment. Martino's team enjoyed a spectacular outset by winning the first eight matches, establishing a new record in the Club's history as the best start to a competition. After the first draw on Osasuna's home ground, Barça faced Real Madrid on day 10. In a fantastic atmosphere, including a mosaic dedicated to Tito Vilanova, the Barça team beat its rival 2-1, with goals from Neymar and Alexis, who put in a masterful chip shot. Barça continued its positive streak of results until the end of the first round and only lost one match, to Athletic, and drew another, at the Calderón stadium. This excellent track record meant that in the middle of the tournament Barça were leaders with 50 points, tied with Atlético de Madrid and three more than Real Madrid. In the end, the second round was marked by irregularity, with unexpected defeats against Valencia at the Camp Nou and against Real Sociedad and Valladolid. Martino's team picked up again with a great victory at the Bernabeu of 3-4, with a hat-trick by Messi that set them back on course. However, a defeat against Granada and a draw with Getafe at the Camp Nou, with two days to go before the final, left Barça pretty much out of options. Slip-ups by the Madrid rivals then gave hope when no one expected it, and after another draw with Elx, the last day arrived whereby if FC Barcelona beat Atlético they would become league champions. The dream was still within reach. A great goal by Alexis at the end of the first half gave Barça the advantage, but Godín, finishing off a corner, made it 1-1 at the start of the second half. Despite efforts to break the draw, the scoreboard didn't move and the chance to take away what would have been the fifth League title in six years slipped away.

Atlético steals away Barça's seventh consecutive semifinal

FC Barcelona was knocked out of the quarterfinals of the Champions' League by Atlético de Madrid, meaning it was unable to play in what would have been the seventh consecutive semifinal in this top European competition. During the first phase of the tournament Barça finished leaders of its group, which included Ajax, Celtic and Milan, with an overall score of four wins, one draw and one defeat. In the last 16, Barça faced its strongest rival: Manchester City. Martino's men left the qualifying round with a decisive result after the first match by defeating Pellegrini's team 0-2, with goals from Messi (penalty) and Alves, in the final moments of the match. During the return match, FC Barcelona ratified its place in the quarterfinals with another 2-1 triumph again with Messi and Alves as scorers. The rivals were Atlético de Madrid, who took the lead during the first match played at the Camp Nou with a spectacular goal by Diego in minute 56. Barça reacted well and in minute 71 a great pass by Iniesta was finished off into the back of the net by Neymar. The final score 1-1 left it all open for the return match. The match at the Calderón stadium started with an early goal by Koke, making it 1-0 in minute 4. Although the Barcelona team tried its best and had several chances to force extra time, the scoreboard didn't move and the road to the final in Lisbon remained blocked.

The title slips away in a cruel final

Barça was unable to win the King's Cup by losing at the end to Real Madrid. Martino's team easily came through the first rounds against Cartagena, Getafe and Llevant. In the semifinals, FC Barcelona faced Real Sociedad. In the first match, played at the Camp Nou, goals by Busquets and Zubikarai (own goal) left the qualifying round quite comfortable for Barça. On the return match, Barça played an excellent first half and Messi, with half an hour to go, made it 0-1 guaranteeing a place in the final. In the last moments of the match Griezmann scored the definitive 1-1. The rivals in the final, held in Valencia, were Real Madrid. The whites got onto the scoreboard with a goal by Di María in their first shot at goal and the score was still 0-1 at half time. In the middle of the second half Marc Bartra equalised the match with a splendid header after a corner throw-in by Xavi. This 1-1 gave the Barça team a boost and they began to dominate the pace of the game. Finally, with just five minutes to go until the end of the match a rapid counter attack by Bale made it 1-2 to the whites. The reaction by Martino's men, in desperation, almost came to fruition. A shot at goal by Neymar Jr alone in front of Casillas was tipped to the left by the whites' goalkeeper while the ball then came back into his hands after hitting the post. Extra time was denied by this piece of bad luck and the title went to the Madrid team.

The eleventh Super Cup

The Barça first team, playing against Atlético de Madrid, won the eleventh Spanish Super Cup in its history. This was the first title of the season. In the first match, played at the Vicente Calderón stadium, Atlético took the lead with a great goal by Villa after a deft counterattack that the former Barça player completed with a volley. In the second half, a header by Neymar gave the equaliser after Alves fed him the ball. This was the first official goal with Barça by the Brazilian star. This equaliser left it all open for the return match at the Camp Nou, which was rather disjointed due to the constant fouls and protests by the visiting team. In the first half, Martino's side had a few chances to change the scoreboard, although Atlético de Madrid could also have scored with a shot by Arda that was saved by an opportune Víctor Valdés. In the final moments of the match Filipe Luis received a yellow card for a foul against Alves and Pedro provoked a penalty that Messi sent wide. The scoreboard remained the same and Barça won the title from the double value of the goals scored away.

Party and goals

The 48th Joan Gamper Trophy was marked by two main attractions: the debut of the new coach, the Argentinian Gerardo 'Tata' Martino, and the newly signed Neymar Jr, who was playing the club he came from, Santos. After an afternoon of activities and fun on the Camp Nou esplanade and the official presentation of the Barça squad, Barça members and fans enjoyed a spectacular set of goals. The match was decided half an hour into the game with goals by Messi, Léo (own goal), Alexis and Pedro. Even though the scoreboard marked 4-0 at half time, Barça continued to show its superiority through goals and fair play. Cesc scored the fifth goal just after Neymar came on to replace Pedro and before the end there were still three goals to be scored: a second by Cesc, one by Adriano and the last by Dongou, who came on to replace Messi. The match was also played in tribute to Antoni Ramallets, the legendary Barça goalkeeper in the 50s, who died a few days before the match.

A very young Barça wins the second consecutive Catalonia Cup

FC Barcelona won the Catalonia Cup for the second year running at the final match played at the Montilivi stadium in Girona. At the semifinals, the Barça team, made up of players from Barça B with Isaac Cuenca from the first team, beat Girona by 3 to 2, with goals by Babunski, Cuenca -penalty- and the captain Ilie Sánchez. The final against Espanyol was a repeat of the match played in the 2012/13 season. Barça, trained by Eusebio, put forward an eleven mainly made up of players from Barça B and some from Juvenil A, while the Espanyol team was also completely made up of players from their affiliate. After the 90 minutes ended 0-0, the title was decided on penalties. The Barça goalkeeper Adrià Ortola became a star by saving three of the five shots by the Espanyol team. Munir ratified the title by putting in the fifth and definitive penalty, which gave them their eighth Catalonia Cup in the history of this competition.

Asian Tour 2013

The Asian continent provided the backdrop for the pre-season tour by the first team. The first stop was Thailand, where FC Barcelona faced the country's national team. The match, played in Bangkok, ended with a resounding set of Barça goals (1-7) by Neymar, his first goal for Barça, Messi (2), Pedro (3) and Alexis. The second part of the trip took them to Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia), where Martino's team beat the Malaysian team 1-3, with goals by Fàbregas, Neymar and Piqué.

The trip to Asia also included various institutional events. The first was in Bangkok, where the FC Barcelona Foundation and Unicef organised a celebration of inclusive sport. Leo Messi and José Manuel Pinto took part in the event, which included twenty children with learning difficulties who played with the two players on a mini football pitch. In Kuala Lumpur, on behalf of the FC Barcelona Foundation, the players from the first team gave out sports material to the organisation *Dignity for Children* before around sixty children. In Bangkok too, Ramon Pont, first vice president of the Foundation, took part in a social event sponsored by the brand H&S.

The pre-season friendlies

Barça played three friendly matches during the pre-season. In the first, our team played against Pep Guardiola's Bayern de Munich. The local team, with more supporters, won 2-0. The first goal was scored by Lahm in minute 13 and in the second half, played mainly with players from the Barça affiliate, Mandzukic scored the second, five minutes before the end. Oslo was the setting for the second pre-season match, where Barça had a comfortable win over Valerenga. Goals by Alexis, Tello, Messi and Dos Santos in the first half and two by Dongou and one from Joan Román in the second, gave them an easy victory of 0-7. Tata Martino, FC Barcelona's new coach, followed the match from La Llotja.

The last of the pre-season friendlies was against Lechia in Gdansk in a match in which Neymar Jr. played for the first time. The Polish team got onto the scoreboard at the start of the match, but Sergi Roberto equalised after a pass from Montoya. Again, at the start of the second half Lechia put the score at 2-1, but only six minutes later Leo Messi made it a two goal draw, which is how the match ended.

Tito Vilanova, best coach of the 2012/13 season

At the Trophy Gala by the sports paper 'Marca', Tito Vilanova was awarded the Miguel Muñoz trophy for the best coach of the 2012/13 season. His award was collected by the advisor to the



president Carles Rexach, on behalf of the Club. Rexach, with the president Rosell, awarded the prize to Tito Vilanova at a private event. Tito Vilanova was awarded the trophy in recognition of the League title Barça won during 2012/13, with a total of 100 points and 15 points ahead of the second team. At the same gala event, Leo Messi was acknowledged as the top scorer of the season with the Pitxitxi trophy.

The third Golden Boot for Messi

At an event held in the former Damm beer factor in Barcelona, the FC Barcelona player Leo Messi was awarded his third Golden Boot as the top goal scorer in the European leagues during the 2012/13 season. The Barça forward scored 46 goals in 32 matches, with an average of 1.43 per match. Messi was awarded the trophy by another famous winner, the former Barça player Hristo Stòitxkov. The event, presented by the journalist Olga Viza, was attended by members of the Governing Board, headed by the president Sandro Rosell, the technical secretary Andoni Zubizarreta, the coach Tata Martino, club and team-mates, family members and important personalities from Catalan society and the sporting world. Leo Messi, who has already won this prestigious award in the 2009/10 season, with 34 goals, and the 2011/12 season with 50 goals, has now become the first footballer in history to win three Golden Boots.

Leo Messi, second in the FIFA Golden Ball 2013

Leo Messi finished second in the FIFA Golden Ball 2013. The Barça player, winner of the prize in the previous four years and among the three finalists in the last seven, was beaten by the Real Madrid player Cristiano Ronaldo. The Argentinian legend obtained 24.72% of the total votes,

while Ronaldo obtained 27.99% and Ribéry, who came third, had 23.36%. This percentage for Messi is the highest score for second place since the FIFA World Player and the Golden Ball France Football merged in 2010. Despite this second place, Leo Messi is the player with the most Golden Balls in history, beating the three obtained by Michel Platini and Johan Cruyff. The other Barça players Neymar Jr and Andrés Iniesta were awarded fifth and sixth positions respectively. In fact Iniesta, along with Dani Alves, Xavi Hernández and Leo Messi, was part of the FIFA/FIFPro World XI 2013, a team selected by votes from over 50,000 footballers from around the world. With four players out of the eleven, Barça, for the eighth year running, was the club with the most representatives.



Leo Messi beats Paulino Alcántara

Leo Messi has beaten Paulino Alcántara as the absolute maximum Barça goal scorer. The Argentinian player totalled 371 goals in official and friendly matches wearing the Barça shirt, scoring three goals in the League match against Osasuna at the Camp Nou. That day, Messi beat the record of 369 goals with the Barça shirt that Paulino Alcántara had held for over 80 years. This great legend played for Barça between 1912 and 1927, with a break of two seasons, and scored a total of 142 official goals and 227 in friendly matches. At the end of the season, Messi had scored 381 goals, of which 354 were in official matches.



Heartfelt and multitudinous farewell to Tito Vilanova

Tito Vilanova (Bellcaire d'Empordà, 17/09/1968 - Barcelona, 25/04/2014), the universally loved and admired Barcelona coach, passed away on 25 April aged 45 after finally succumbing to the illness that forced him to give up the first team bench in July. His death was a heavy blow for FC Barcelona, for its players and all its fans. The Club declared three days of mourning in order to say goodbye to "a human and footballing legend", in the words of the president Josep Maria Bartomeu.

Words of sympathy flooded in from all around the world. Fans from all football colours came together in profound sadness at his death. FCB set up a memorial area at the stand entrance of the Camp Nou where fans were able to say goodbye to Tito by signing a book of condolences, lighting a candle or leaving a souvenir in his memory.

The popular homage exceeded all expectations. The multitudinous farewell demonstrated how much of a mark the Catalan coach had left, not just on the world of football and sport, but also on society in general. A total of 52,999 people came to the FC Barcelona facilities at the Camp Nou to pay their final respects. Various institutional personalities, such as the president of the Catalan Regional Government, Artur Mas, the mayor of Barcelona, Xavier Trias, and people



from the world of sport and society also took part in the popular homage in the condolences area of the Club.

The final public farewell to Tito Vilanova took place in Barcelona cathedral. The religious ceremony, presided over by the Archbishop of Barcelona, Lluís Martínez Sistach, was the most solemn time during the three days of pain and sadness. The Basilica was too small for the act, meaning its capacity had to be extended from 900 to 1500 people, while many people had to stay outside. It was an important event that brought together the Barça family and the former presidents Agustí Montal, Josep Lluís Núñez, Joan Gaspart, Enric Reyna, Joan Laporta and Sandro Rosell. Raimon Carrasco was unable to attend for health reasons.

The president of FC Barcelona, Josep Maria Bartomeu, opened the speeches with the special words: "We are saying goodbye to a much loved person. A good and young man. A man of integrity, a humble and honest man who always looked ahead and who became known for his personal culture of hard work, fight and triumph".

Tito Vilanova's wife, Montse Chaure, listened with emotion to the unforgettable speeches by their children, Carlota and Adrià, (a player in Barça's Juvenil B), and their close friend, Jordi Roura.



Tito, forever remembered

Víctor Valdés says goodbye to fans

Víctor Valdés suffered a broken anterior cruciate ligament of his right knee on 26 March in a match against Celta. In this cruel manner the career of the best goalkeeper in the history of Barça came to an end. Valdés, who a year before had publicly renounced renewing his contract, which was to end on 30 June, was unable to say goodbye to Barça fans on the pitch and did so through a letter in which he expressed his gratitude to everyone who had helped him throughout his time at FC Barcelona. Valdés bade farewell with a special mention for the fans: "Of course I can't forget the people who have meant so much to me over these twelve years as a professional, wearing this shirt and these are the people who have followed me faithfully. The people who, whatever happens, are always there to give the boost any fighter may need at any time, who are proud to see me at every celebration, giving support at every match, sending out this positive energy that I have always felt, which kept me going the whole time because without this, I would not have been able to do it alone. Thank you, thank you and a thousand times thank you. And I ask you to please never stop supporting me".

Valdés wore the Barça shirt for 12 years as a professional player. He arrived at the Barça Masia in 1991 and debuted with the first team on 14 August 2002. During his time in the first team he played 535 matches and overall helped to win 21 titles, which includes the Champions in Paris 2006, Rome 2009 and Wembley 2011, in which he played a vital role in the finals; six Leagues, two King's Cups, six Spanish Super Cups, two European Super Cups and two Club World Cups.



Carles Puyol hangs up his boots, but will stay at Barça

The legendary captain of Barça, after 15 seasons in the first team, bade farewell as a player on 15 May at an emotional event held in the 1899 Auditorium, accompanied by family members, colleagues, friends and many of the personalities from football who have been by his side throughout his career. Puyol thanked all the entities that form part of FC Barcelona for their help and support. He will stay linked to the club as assistant to the sports director Andoni Zubizarreta in the Football Area.

Puyol made a heartfelt speech in which he explained: "As I told you a few months ago, my knee problems have not cleared up. I've tried everything. This is why as of 30 June my time as a player in Barça is over. I'd like to thank all the doctors and physios in the Club and also all the external doctors and physios who have helped me throughout the process. We've tried to find a solution, so far unsuccessfully, but I'm not just sitting back - I'll keep trying without the pressure of having to play". The heroic captain confessed: "If, when I was a little boy in Pobla, playing with my brother or my friend Javi Pérez, they'd told me I would have this career I wouldn't have believed it. I've lived the dream of a lot of children. I know I've been very privileged because for 19 years I've got up every morning and gone to do what I love doing most, which is training and playing football".

Lastly, Puyol had words of thanks for the fans. He also remembered certain people who unfortunately are no longer with us and who were very important to him: Antonio Oliveres, his father, Miki Roqué, Luis Aragonés and Tito Vilanova.

Historic season for Barça B

The Barça affiliate team equalled the top ranking in history in the Second Division and finished third with 66 points. Eusebio Sacristán's side made great progress during the season and finished in great shape at just 3 points from the second team, Deportivo, and five from the Champions, Eibar. Meanwhile, for the fourth year running Barça B were awarded the Fair Play prize as the team with the fewest cards in the category. FCB Escola

The FCB Escola closes another successful season with further expansion around the world. Barça's working methodology educates boys and girls aged between 6 and 12 and is divided into three categories: Introduction, with players aged between 6 and 8; Pre-training, between 8 and 10; and Training, aged between 10 and 12; for a total of 370 students. Over the last four months over 90,000 young players have benefited from the Barça experience in different points around the globe in academies, summer schools and other activities. Some of the countries where FCB Escola has participated this season include the United States, Canada, Chile, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Italy, India, Croatia, Slovenia, China, Japan and Brazil.

One of the best moments in the season was the third FCB Escola International Tournament, attended by 800 children from eleven different countries and in which over 200 matches were played. The closing ceremony, which was held in the Ministadium, brought over 2,000 people to the stands. Meanwhile, the season ended with a closing day at the Camp Nou where the 370 young footballers were awarded graduation photos and diplomas in recognition of their hard work throughout the season.



Spectacular double



The Women's A team exceeded themselves in another season when it seemed as if they had reached their peak. Xavi Llorens's side repeated the double from last season and won the league and the Queen's Cup and also reached the quarterfinals of the UEFA Women's Champions League, where they were defeated by the champions Wolfsburg. In the League, Barça were declared champions three days before the end after beating Atlético Women's team on their home ground (0-3), thus winning their third consecutive League. Also, they only lost one match on the penultimate day when they had already won the title. In the Women's Champions, Xavi Llorens's girls gave a great performance until finally succumbing in the quarterfinals to the team that later became champions, Wolfsburg Germany. Overall, Barça repeated the double of last year by winning the Queen's Cup in an agonising final that went to penalties against Athletic Club after a draw in extra time. In the eleven metre shots, Barça did not miss and Laura Ràfols saved one to give them their fourth Queen's Cup and the second double title running.

Barça's Girls Infantil-Aleví team were declared champions of the First Division Girl's U12 with a five point advantage over Espanyol. Of the 22 matches played, the young Barça players won 21 and only drew 1. The Barça team were the highest scorers with 298 goals and the fewest goals conceded: 19. At the end of the season, Albert Tausté's girls won the championship title of the Catalonia Cup after beating Mercantil by 3 goals to 0.

Coaching and dialogue

For another season, the Masia continued its principal aim of training the young players who live there. As well as their formal education, the training and cultural plan this year was based around two sections: training discussions and an area for dialogue, and the teaching projects themselves.

At the beginning of the season the Masia residents received a visit from the entrepreneur Albert Riba. Riba is associate lecturer at the EADA business school and the Salle URL and author of the book *Mamut o Sàpiens. Les 10 inquietuds vitals per adaptar-se i emprendre*. (Mammoth or Sapiens. 10 vital concerns for adapting and engaging). The discussion included how to face failure and learn from mistakes as well as the frustration of not reaching our goals and learning from errors in order to be better tomorrow.

A second discussion was held with the synchronised swimming Olympic runners-up in London and the women's water polo team, Barcelona World champions in the summer of 2013. This was a unique experience for the residents of the Masia to experience the tremendous effort put in by these sportspeople in terms of hours dedicated to a sport in which they may not be professionals but are no less high level sports people.

One of the highlights of the teaching projects was *The 12 Pillars* coaching exercise in individual and small group formats, aimed at establishing a bridge between the trainers and the sporting youth. The 12 Pillar method includes habits and skills that are useful for the youngsters to guide them when taking decisions and for learning to be accountable for their actions. After an assessment of the workshops last year, this season the reading club was continued. Eleven boys from 10 to 13 years were involved every week from November until March. This activity is carried out completely in Catalan and includes a combination of reading and oral activities focused on enhancing expression and resources for speaking in public.

A new feature this season was the starting up of a mental arithmetic workshop lasting sixteen sessions, in which the youngest members of the residence learnt to do sums using an abacus and performed other academic and mental arithmetic exercises. There was also a photography and video course for Barça B football players. The aim of the course was to familiarise participants with the computer tools around them through audiovisual production.

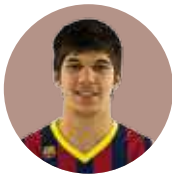

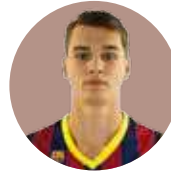

Real Madrid defeated. Champions!

After two years, the basketball team has won the Endesa League again. Xavi Pascual's team made terrific progress throughout the competition and won the title after coming through two qualifying rounds with the court factor against them, as they had just finished third in the normal League (with an overall score of 27 wins and 7 defeats). In the quarterfinals Barça beat Laboral Kutxa by two wins to zero. In a tough first match Barça, with Navarro and Oleson playing splendidly and together totalling 53 points, beat the Basque team in the Palau by 92-87. In the second match, playing in Vitoria, Xavi Pascual's team were clearly superior and guaranteed themselves a place in the next round with a great victory: 71-95. The semifinals were complete madness. Barça seemed to have sealed its place in the final after the two wins at La Fonteta: 58-77 in the first match and 59-60 in the second with a thrilling final and a decisive shot by Tomic in the final moments of the match. Surprisingly and when everything seemed to be clear-cut, the Valencia team came back with two consecutive wins at the Palau by 70-74 and 63-81. In the fifth and final match, played in Valencia, Barça won by 75-77 thanks to a great shot in the last second by a magnificent Marcelinho Huertas, who scored 22 points. With this nail-biting victory, Barça went through to the League final for the eighth year running. The first match, played in Madrid, was critical in the qualifying round process. Xavi Pascual's team won spectacularly, 93-98, in a match in which success in the three-pointers and free shots were emphatic. Real Madrid came back in the second to equalise in the qualifying round. In the third, played to a packed Palau, FC Barcelona managed a second victory of 94-79, with a true demonstration of excellent play and magnificent work by Navarro, Nachbar and Oleson. Barça was just one step away from winning the title and in a magical night at the Palau they managed it. Pascual's team had kept ahead on the scoreboard but the whites drew even in the last stretch. A three-pointer by Lampe with 21 seconds to go and free shots by Abrines and Oleson in the final seconds gave them the 83-81 victory in a match in which Tomic was a star with 22 points and 9 rebounds. The captain, Navarro, who was awarded MVP, held up the 18th League trophy to the euphoric spectators.

Magnificent build-up but disappointment in the semifinals

After fantastic progress throughout the competition, Barça's basketball team was knocked out in the semifinals of the Final Four. In the first stage of the tournament, Barça finished third, with an overall score of seven wins and three defeats, behind the powerful Turkish Fenerbahçe and Russian CSKA. In the Top-16, Xavi Pascual's team clearly dominated its group and won the first 12 matches, playing at an extremely high level. It was especially difficult to win at the Fenerbahçe, Olympiacos, Panathinaikos, Caja Laboral, Efes Pielsen and Unicaja stadiums. With first place of the Top 16 guaranteed and the court factor in their favour for the quarterfinals, they suffered two inconsequential defeats in the last two matches. In the quarterfinals, Barça beat the Turkish Galatasaray unequivocally by three to zero and for the fifth time in the last six years gained a place for the Final Four in Milan. In the semifinals, against Real Madrid, Barça got off to an excellent start (12-4) but then paid a high price for errors made in free shots and a bad second half in which Madrid took the lead (37-45). In the third period, a negative partial score of 11-28 knocked Barça out and they threw in the towel in a match they ended up losing by 62 to 100. In the consolation final Barça emphatically beat CSKA from Moscow by 93 to 78, with a great match by Juan Carlos Navarro, who scored 20 points.

The Cup slips through our fingers

Barça was unable to win back the King's Cup in basketball after losing in a nail-biting final played in Malaga. The quarterfinals match against Iberostar Tenerife gave Barça a runaway victory. Marcelinho Huertas, top scorer with 13 points and Àlex Abrines, who scored 12, were the most outstanding players in the unequivocal victory over the Canary Island team, with a win of over 40 points (102-60). In the semifinals, the Catalan team eradicated Valencia by 89 to 81 in another serious match by Xavi Pascual's men. FC Barcelona, led by captain Joan Carles Navarro, who scored 20 points, dominated the match from start to finish. The rivals in the final were Real Madrid. After the first two quarters Barça left for the break four points ahead (42-38). A perfect League

Barça made history in the Asobal League by winning all its matches, a milestone that had only been achieved by BM Ciudad Real in the 2009/10 season. Xavi Pascual's team managed 30 victories in the 30 matches played and won their fourth consecutive League, the 21st in the history of the section. The total superiority that Barça showed throughout the tournament was demonstrated by winning all the matches played at Barcelona's Palau by a minimum of eleven goals' difference and all the matches away by a minimum of five goals. As well as finishing as victors of the competition, Barça established a new record in the Asobal League with 1,146 goals, comfortably beating the goal record set by BM Atlético de Madrid of 1,047. The title was won mathematically five days before the end of the competition when they beat BM Aragón by 48-22. This tremendous result was the best in the season, not only for the number of goals but also the difference. The last match held in the Palau, against Osca, enabled Barça fans to pay tribute to Juanín García, who, after nine years and 27 titles won, left Barça at the end of the season. Barça's supremacy in the league in recent years is overwhelming; for example, in the last four seasons, when Barcelona have been declared champions, they played a total of 120 matches of which they won 117.

Disappointing outcome in the semifinals

The extra time started evenly and even though Karabatic had a last shot at victory, the match ended in a draw at 36. A place in the final was decided on penalties, in which Karabatic missed his shot and the Germans managed all five. With no time to digest the defeat, Barça played the match for third and fourth place, in which they beat Veszprem by 26-25.

Four years later, Champions again!

Barça won the 18th King's Cup, a title that had eluded it since 2010. After comfortably beating Illa de Aranda and Puerto Sagunto, in the round-of-sixteen and quarterfinals respectively, Xavi Pascual's team reached the Final Four held in Pamplona as favourites. In the semifinals, Barça faced the host team, Helvetia Anaitasuna, and the match was sewn up in the first half with a clear 10-17. In the second half, FC Barcelona kept its lead and the match ended at 28-36. The rivals in the final were another Catalan team, Fraikin BM Granollers. The match began quite evenly but towards the middle of the first half Barça improved its defence and goals by Noddesbo and Sarmiento gave it a leading score at the break (22-17). The twenty-fifth league title!

Ricard Muñoz's Barça once again dominated in this competition, after just missing out in the 2012/13 season, and managed to win back the 25th League title in the section's history. Barça demonstrated constancy throughout the tournament and were declared Champions four days before the end, making them the earliest winning team since the OK League recovered its format as a regular League in the 2009/10 season. The title first came into sight after a practically perfect first round, as of the fifteen matches played FC Barcelona won fourteen and drew one. Although Barça encountered Igualada in the Palau on day 20, their winning streak continued until they won the title mathematically four days before the end with an 8-4 victory against Reus, with two goals from Pablo Álvarez, two from Reinaldo, two from Marc Torra, one from Gual and one from Marín. Ricard Muñoz's men completed the season with a spectacular score of 27 wins, two draws and one defeat and a total score of 207 goals, an unprecedented figure since the creation of the OK League in the year 2002/03. This makes an average of around seven goals per match. Pablo Álvarez was also awarded the Pitxitxi for top scorer in the history of the OK League for his total of 56 goals.

Even though the scores were equal, Ricard Muñoz's team were not demoralised and kept trying for goals. A powerful shot by Xavi Barroso and a deft deflection by Torra slipped in the definitive 3-1. A triumphant Egurrola lifted his first European league title as captain and his ninth in goal before an exuberant Palau.

The second in history!

Barça Alusport made history in Bakú, capital of Azerbaijan, by winning the second UEFA Futsal Cup, the sport's most prestigious European title. Barça went through comfortably to the Final Four after achieving first place in the Elite Round. The semifinal against the host team, Araz Naxçıvan, was breathtaking. A Barça goal by Dyego put the score at 1-2, but the Russian team managed to equalise and the match ended 2-2. At the start of extra time Fernandao made it 2-3 and the Russian team gave it their all using their goalkeeper. Two goals by Sergio Lozano and the goalkeeper Paco Sedano from his own area clinched the final and this 2-5 gave them their second UEFA Futsal Cup in the section's history.

Furthermore, Barça athlete Ana Peleteiro received the HRH Princess Letizia National Princess of Asturias Award given to the sportswoman under 18 who has shown the most outstanding sporting progress.

The Club's training team once again had a great season and obtained good results in and outside Catalonia. Meanwhile, CVB Barça played and organised the first International Women's Volleyball Tournament at the end of the season.

In the best hands

Confidence in the Medical Services is a fundamental aspect and one that must therefore be monitored, as it is difficult to maintain and very easy to lose. This is why a pledge to increase expertise in sports medicine applied to the Club's sports must be solid and structured at all times. Over the course of this 2013/14 season a series of activities has been carried out to enhance expertise and increase sports medicine courses for all professionals in the Medical Services with participation from national and international experts.

They also worked with one of the most prestigious physiology institutes in the world, Gatorade Sports Science Institute, to agree on and draw up Guidelines for Nutrition and Supplements for sportspeople.

Next season 2014/15 work will start on a new organisation based not only on resource management but also on knowledge management, to develop an area of clinical expertise and assessment of results, a physiology area, an area of football expertise and a research area. The latter will be linked to the project Muscle Tech Network, which the Club and other public and private bodies is promoting for research into muscles and tendons. The annual meeting of the MuscleTech Network took place in October 2013 in the Club's Auditorium 1899.

These meetings are global reference points as a forum for researchers and doctors to exchange and discuss latest trends and innovations in skeletal muscle and tendon areas. The meetings are organised by FC Barcelona and the Leitat Technology Centre with collaboration from the FC Barcelona Foundation and the Leo Messi and Egarsat Foundation. This coming season 2013/14 the workshop will take place in collaboration with Aspetar (Doha centre for sports medicine, one of the current cornerstones of expertise in the discipline).

This last season there were also various courses on how to act in sports medicine emergency situations, which will continue for the next two seasons. Professionals from the Medical Services took part in these structured courses and in the future sports professionals (technicians, 'staff'...) will also participate. It will be a theory and practical course culminating in drills in the various sports areas of the Club.

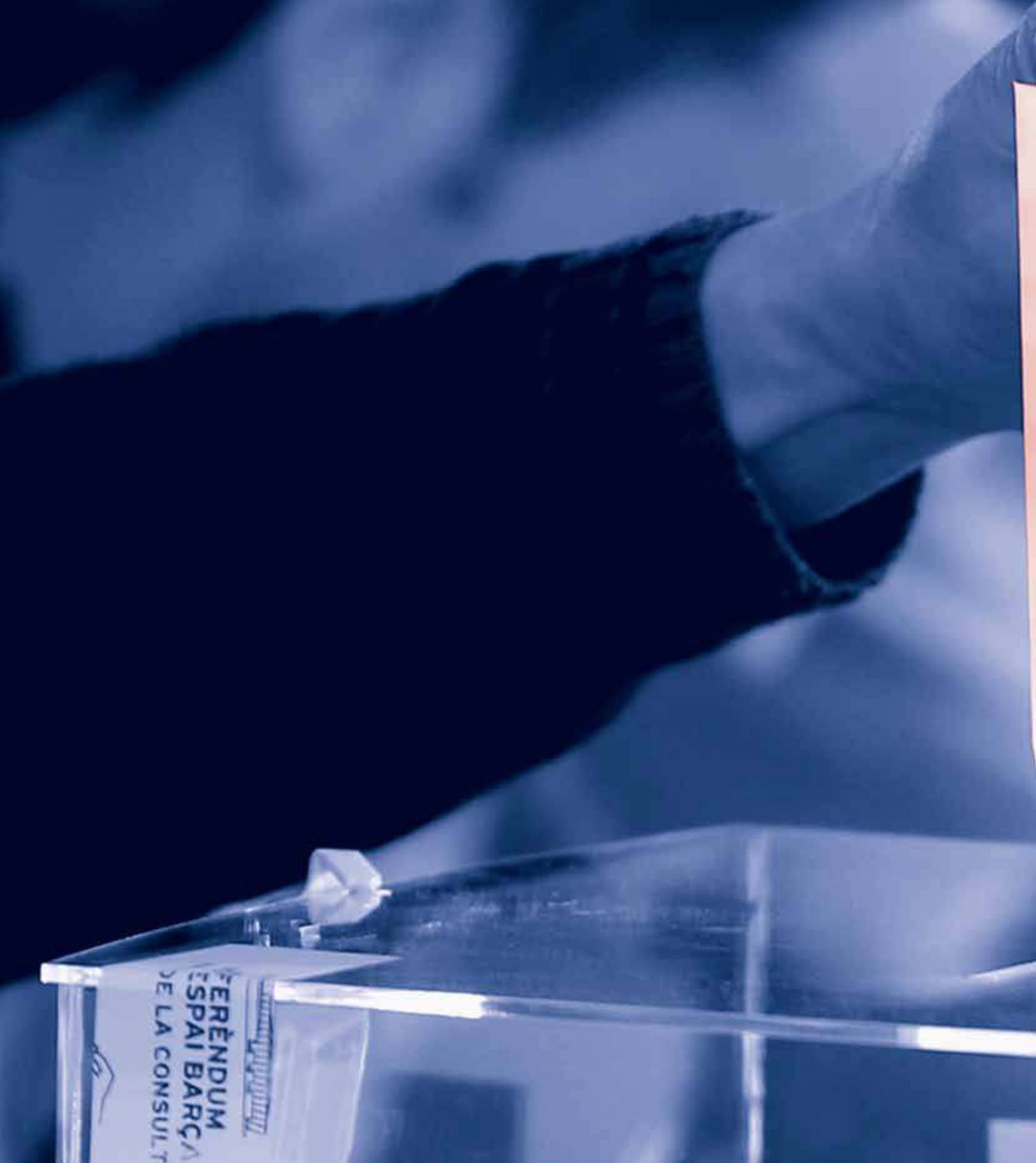


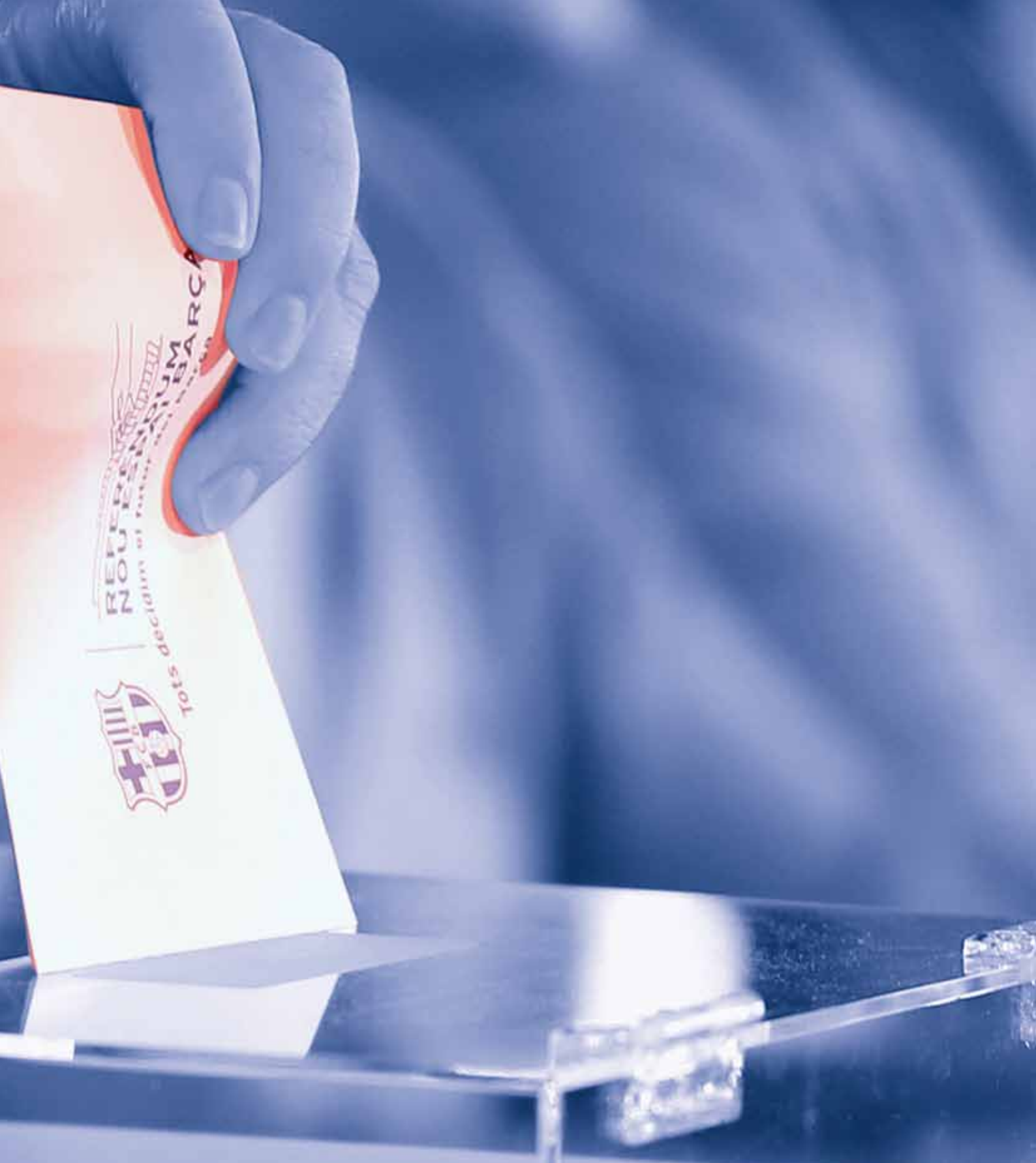

The New Espai Barça receives majority support from members



Exhibitions and briefing sessions

One of the major communication tools in response to the Governing Board's commitment to providing maximum information about the New Espai Barça to members before the Referendum were the exhibitions made about the proposal and the briefing sessions with various member groups. During the briefing campaign, from 6 March to 2 April (three days before the Referendum), a total of 50,704 people received information about the New Espai Barça in person at the briefing sessions as well as the touring and permanent exhibitions located at the Camp Nou.

The exhibition presented the New Espai Barça, the proposal to construct the best sporting complex in the world in the heart of a great city and based on the Stadium's current structure, which will lead it into the future with a set of transformations that aim to guarantee excellence in the quality of its services and that will project its life beyond the 21st century.

The permanent exhibition was installed in the area adjacent to the FCBotiga Megastore in the Camp Nou and consisted of a multimedia sample of the proposal, in a space of over 400 m². Further to the interest it arose among members and fans, the Club decided to reopen the permanent exhibition the day after the Referendum, on 6 April until 30 June. During the period between 6 March, the day it was opened, until 27 June, the exhibition was visited by a total of 169,692 people. An adaptation of this permanent exhibition of the New Espai Barça could be seen in the FC Barcelona Museum from the first week of July.

Meanwhile, the touring exhibitions that were taken around the country meant the proposal could be shown to members and fans from different points of the country. From 6 March to 2 April, the last day of the exhibition, a total of 6,135 people visited the 26 visiting exhibitions and the two presentations made in Madrid and Andorra. The exhibitions were at all times accompanied by a speech by a member of the Governing Board and a question and answer session by those attending.

The briefing sessions carried out in the Club's facilities brought the proposal directly to various collectives (senate, fan clubs, Casal de l'Avi, OAE advisory table, Barça Players Association, members on the waiting list for the Camp Nou and members of the Palau Blaugrana).



The New Espai Barça stopped being a proposal and became a project when FC Barcelona members voted 'Yes' on 5 April by a vast majority. The project will get underway in May 2017, which is when work will start. This will last three seasons and four summers, until March 2021, and will turn the Camp Nou into a cutting-edge stadium with every facility.

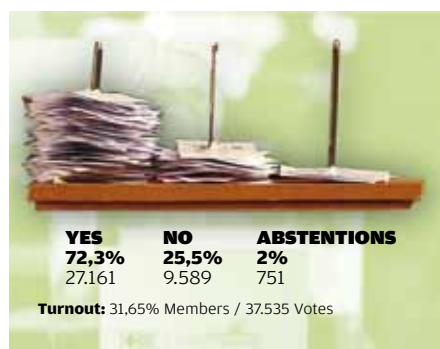
Barça members gave the green light to an exciting project. Of the 37,535 members who used their right to vote, a total of 27,161 (72.36% of the total) voted 'Yes' to the proposal, very much higher than the 9,589 members who voted 'No' (25.55%).

The president, Josep Maria Bartomeu, indicated that Barcelonism had undergone "a democratic celebration, an historic episode that the new generations of Barça fans will celebrate". The president acknowledged that throughout the entire voting day many members came up to him to tell them what they thought about the New Espai Barça proposal: "they told me that they were voting in favour of a project that most probably, due to their age, they may not even see, but that they had come to vote to guarantee a better Camp Nou and a better Barça for their grandchildren". Bartomeu, however, also thanked members who decided to vote 'No'. "I have to thank you for your vote and tell you that we will prove that what we are doing is good for the Club



and you will be proud. We are working for a better club". The New Espai Barça includes the construction of a New Camp Nou that takes advantage of the present structure, a new Palau with 10,000 seats in order to be able to compete in the basketball Euroleague and a Minipalau annex, as well as buildings for complementary activities and a garden area that will blend the complex into the city's neighbouring area. The Club is facing a very exciting future challenge with a dual objective: firstly, to improve FC Barcelona's assets with facilities that

will put it on a par with the top clubs in the world and secondly to enhance member comfort. In this sense, the New Espai Barça project focuses on the Stadium's practicality, comfort and enjoyment. The



project therefore anticipates improving access for cars and pedestrians, faster seat access (it will take five minutes to reach or leave the third stands), removal of architectural barriers and replacing steps with ramps, lifts and escalators.

Climatic comfort will also improve substantially as the Stadium will be covered. Furthermore, the car park capacity will be extended to 5,000 spaces. Services will be improved in quantity and quality (more and better toilets and eateries, elimination of smells in the Stadium).

The extension of the capacity of the stadium to 105,000 seats will enable a large part of the new seats to be allocated to members on the waiting list. Financing the New Espai Barça will not require any extra payments by members. Nor will the quota be increased.

Regarding the New Palau, members will also enjoy a wider range of services, shops, eating and leisure areas. The site will have no architectural barriers and visual obstacles will also be removed. Members will not be affected by the works as the new pavilion will be built on the current site of the Ministadium.

A unique space that will blend in with the Les Corts neighbourhood

The 20 hectares of land owned by Barça in the Les Corts neighbourhood will be completely remodelled and enjoy an enhanced structure with the New Espai Barça. In 2021, when the project will have been completed, Barça will have the best sports complex in the world in the centre of a great city. The estimated total cost is 600 million Euro, with a finance plan that anticipates funding the project through own resources, sponsors and a bank loan.

Apart from the sports buildings (New Camp Nou, New Palau and Palau annex), the proposal includes a series of urban planning improvements to upgrade the surroundings and develop the area as a whole. The entire project anticipates energy efficiency and environmental sustainability criteria.

At the moment the Barça complex is surrounded by fences and the intention is that the whole area should form part of the neighbourhood,

with open areas that can be accessed freely and enjoyed by residents and visitors.

The underground car park with 5000 spaces is the key factor in eliminating as far as possible the traffic surrounding the esplanade to be created between the Stadium and the Palau (which will be built on the current Ministadium grounds) and to generate a large green area for leisure. The complementary buildings for members and fan clubs will be constructed here, along with the new modern and centralised Club offices.

It will also be important for economic exploitation of the site to have a new Museum and an FCB Botiga Megastore, even bigger than the current shop. Another pending issue that will be addressed by the New Espai Barça is an improvement of restaurant services with a broader and more varied offer for the over three million people who visit the Barça facilities every year.

The New Camp Nou

A new and modern Camp Nou with the latest facilities for 105,000 spectators

The stadium might be new, but it should retain the emotional and collective memory of the original Camp Nou. This is the aspiration for the profound transformation of the Stadium proposed in the New Espai Barça. The New Camp Nou anticipates the building of over 100,000 m² covered and 50,000 m² outdoor areas.

Practicality, comfort and enjoyment in the Stadium are the keys to a successful transformation of the Camp Nou, which will afford considerable benefits for members. The Stadium will guarantee optimum conditions for enjoying matches. It will be a covered stadium, with excellent visibility from any seat and with a set of measures that will improve comfort for everyone.

Reaching the New Camp Nou will also be easier by car and on foot- meaning it will be quicker to get there and quicker to leave.

Inside, too, it will be easier to move about. Areas will be wider and more open to ensure a fast and easy flow of people and accesses will be more

practical with no architectural barriers. The steps will be removed and replaced by ramps, lifts and escalators.

It will be much easier to access the venue and also to leave. It will be possible to reach or leave the third stand in five minutes.

Climatic comfort is guaranteed. All seats will be covered, providing shelter. There will be no more rain or wind at the Stadium.

The New Camp Nou will also substantially improve its services: more and better toilets and eateries. This will eliminate smells from the Stadium and aid cleaning services.

The expanding of the Stadium's capacity will enable the member waiting list to be closed. A part of the extension of the new capacity will be devoted to the people on the list.

During the works period, members will still be able to access all matches throughout the season as the works will last three seasons and four summers, from 2017 to 2021 and will be carried out in stages. In the summer work will take place on the stands and during the season work will take place on the interiors.





The New Palau

On a par with top sports pavilions in Europe The new Palau will be one of the most modern and functional in Europe and will satisfy every standard and requirement for all competitions. Works will start in the summer of 2017 and go on until 2019. The capacity of the New Palau will be for 10,000 people, which could be increased to 12,000. The facilities will also have an annex pavilion that will include an ice rink.

At the moment, and for several years, the FC Barcelona basketball team has a moratorium from the Euroleague regarding their pavilion. The minimum requirements for a team with licence A - which are roughly teams that have a fixed position - are a pavilion for at least 10,000 people. Therefore, the new Palau is vital for being able to continue competing among the top European teams and also for improving conditions for Palau members. There are currently 1,000 seats with reduced visibility, there are architectural barriers, there are no service points for medical attention for visitors and its restaurant service is also insufficient.

A key point of the new home to the Barça sections is better service for the spectator. The New Palau will meet all the standards set by current regulations in terms of the number and distribution of washrooms. Meanwhile, there will also be a fully equipped clinic for spectators, merchandise points of sales and information services. There will also be a varied selection of places to eat equipped with all the necessary facilities and equipment.



An economically sustainable New Espai Barça

The project financing plan anticipates paying the 600 million Euro for the whole project through own resources, sponsors and a bank loan. The New Espai Barça complies with all the requirements for economic sustainability that the Governing Board set out in order for it to be considered feasible. This is an obligatory requirement, as the very nature of the Club (owned by its members and not a millionaire who injects money or by a board of directors that can inject increases of capital, which is the case for other clubs) means that a third of the total cost of 600 million Euro is paid by own resources. The other third will be paid by funding from

banks, thanks to the fact that the Club has been able to reduce its current debt to 200 million Euro in 2016. The third part will be financed by a sponsor who will have their brand name after the Camp Nou name. This is known as 'title rights' - putting a surname on the Stadium without losing the name Camp Nou. Members will not have to make any extra contributions to the funding of the New Espai Barça, or advance their membership fees. Nor does the funding plan for the new stadium anticipate a compulsory increase in quotas.

INTERNAL FUNDING

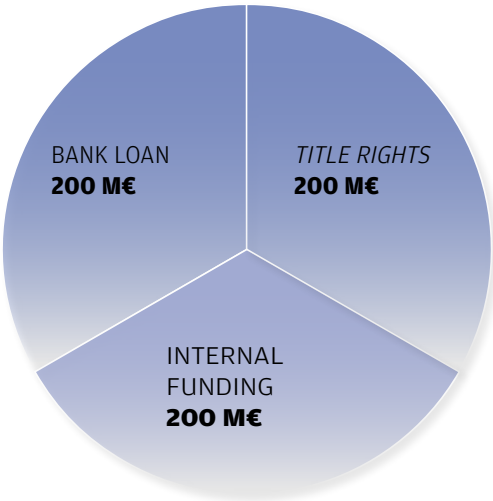
The Club remains committed to investing in players but every year will generate additional cash flow to invest in the project.

After cancelling the current bank loan in 2015, the Club will be in a very healthy financial position to be able to fund itself through a new syndicate credit facility for the sole purpose of the project.

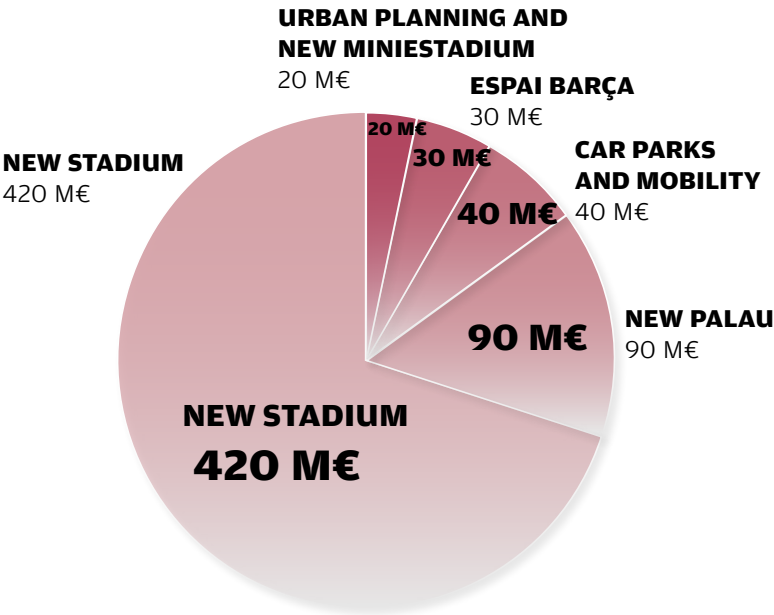

New Statutes that manifest Barça's uniqueness

On 17 January 2011, the Governing Board appointed members of the external and independent Commission to work on and present a reform proposal for the Club's Statutes. This was the start of a process that came to an end on 5 October with the approval of the new FC Barcelona Carta Magna by delegates. This was the most important moment of the Ordinary General Assembly 2013, held in the Palau Blaugrana. Approval was required by two thirds of attending voters and after a long and informative discussion, in the end the result of the vote was 320 votes for, 65 against and 35 blank.

The vice president Jordi Cardoner called the vote "historic", as it confirmed approval of new Statutes that would "bring the Club closer to members", one of the main objectives of the Social Area for which he is responsible. The secretary and spokesperson of the Board, Toni Freixa, explained to members the principal keystones of the reform, splitting the modifications into four categories according to the reasons that determine the changes: an improved text, better adaptation to reality, better adaptation to current legislation and new legislation.

The new Statutes include important social regulations to encourage participation by members and bolster the Club's democratic operating along with a feeling of belonging. Therefore, among other new features, they state that the day of the Assembly should coincide with an official match at the Stadium, that people can vote electronically and that members who wish to renounce being delegates can do so in order that other members can take their place. It also anticipates publishing delegates' data. The

Assembly should give authorisation to potential sponsors of the Stadium and the Palau, as well as the sponsor of the first team's shirt.

The new Statutes also state that the electoral census will be available to all candidates, which has been a long-standing claim. In order to be elected president, the candidate must have at least ten years' seniority as member, while directors must have five. In order to adapt to the Sports Law in the event of a vote of no confidence a quorum of 15% of members will be required or 50% of delegates. Also, the right of the Board to appoint these 25 delegates will be removed, as already applied in this Assembly.

The other major changes refer to the financial control mechanisms as explained by the vice president for the economic area Javier Faus. The principal change is the prohibiting of closing financial years with losses by the Governing Board and a maximum limit of net debt, in accordance with objective criteria. If this occurs, a period of two years is granted to become profitable again and if losses continue, the Governing Board will be terminated early.

The president for the statutes reform commission, Joan Manuel Trayter, highlighted in his final report that lawyers who carried out the project worked "with complete autonomy" and opted for a more democratic model at the expense of a more presidential model "which a rival club has adopted".

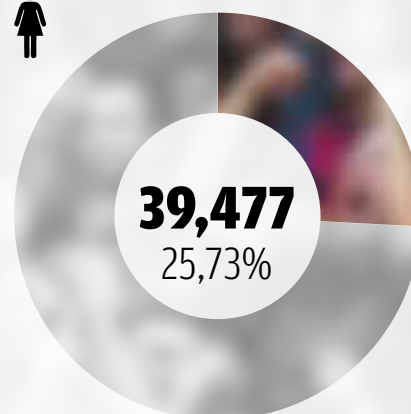
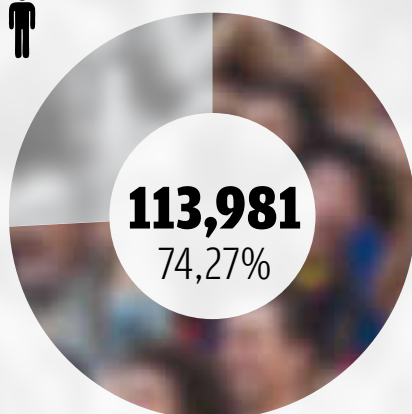

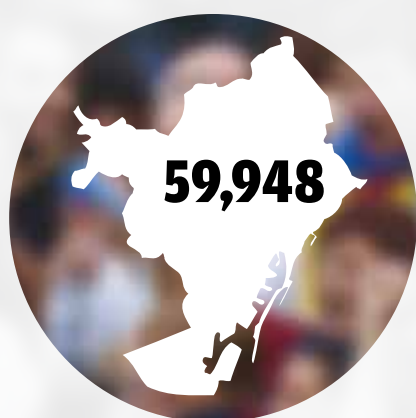
Total members

Barcelona city

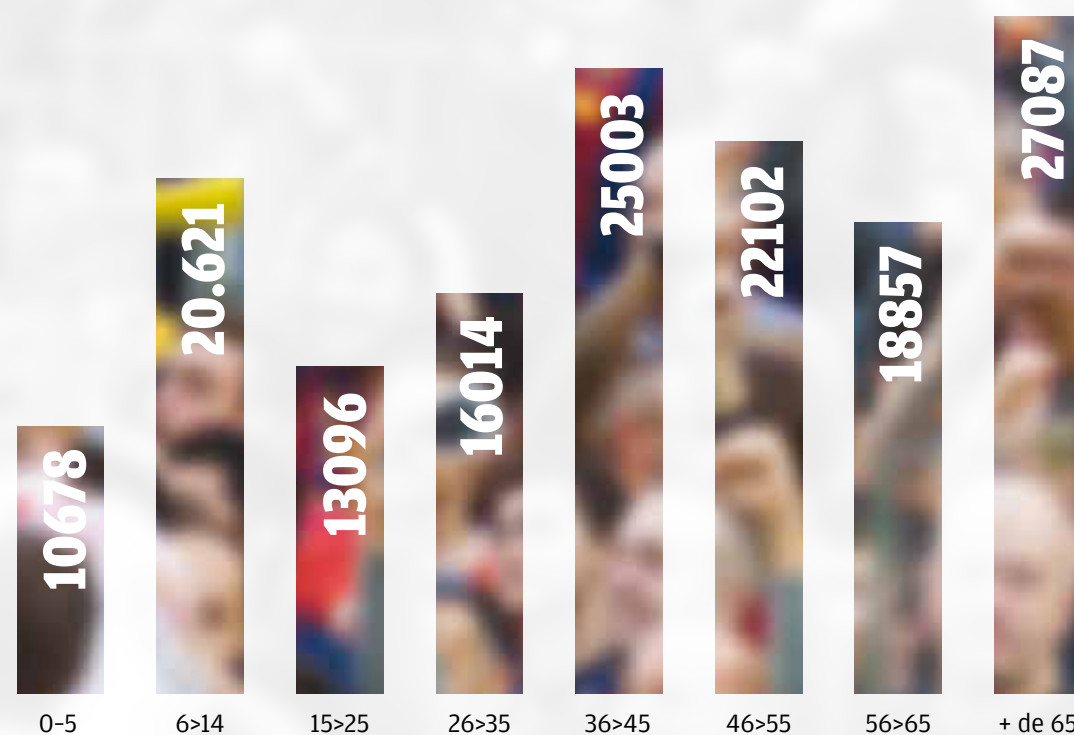


Rest of Catalonia

Assembly of delegates

The General Assembly of delegates, held in the Palau Blaugrana, approved comfortably the three main points to be discussed: financial year-end 2012/13, the budget for the 2013/14 season and the Club Statutes reform proposal. The financial year-end for the 2012/13 season, with 32.5 million Euro profit was approved unanimously with 523 votes in favour, 12 against and 13 in blank. Meanwhile, with 511 votes in favour, 12 against and 19 in blank, the delegates approved the 2013/14 budget, which anticipates an income of 508.5 million Euro and expenses of 457.7 million. The Statutes reform needed 2/3 of the votes and the result was

clearly pro the new text with 320 votes in favour, 65 against and 35 in blank. The changes mainly affect the economic and social areas, such as prohibiting year-end closures with losses by a Governing Board or the assigning of more competences to the Assembly, which will have to approve any issue relating to the Stadium or Palau, and the shirt of the football first team.

A few days before the Assembly, the Club arranged briefing sessions in the Auditorium 1899 about the Statutes' Reform proposal and other points on the agenda. All members were invited to attend the sessions.

Senate Meetings

Extraordinary meeting (5 March)

The Senate extraordinary meeting was held in the Auditorium 1899, with the sole aim of reporting in the first instance on the New Espai Barça project presented for referendum by members on 5 April 2014. The informative campaign of the New Espai Barça got underway after the presentation of the permanent exhibition to the 194 senators who attended, with significant representation by the Governing Board and headed by president Bartomeu, who explained the details of the project. The FC Barcelona senate is an advisory collegiate and honorary body made up of the thousand longest serving club members.

Ordinary meeting (11 June)

The president, Josep Maria Bartomeu, accompanied by the Governing Board, had a meeting with the senators and was therefore able to meet the longest-serving members of the Club. This was the ordinary meeting of the Senate of FC Barcelona, within the framework of the Statute regulation, which is held in the second quarter of each natural year by this important part of the Club.

The event was held in the Auditorium 1899. The Barça president presented the agenda with an overview of the Club's situation to a total of 131 senators - the number of members in the advisory body who attended.



Presenting of loyalty badges

Gold badge presentation

On 24 September, to coincide with the 56th anniversary of the inauguration of the Camp Nou and on the Mercè Saint's Day the traditional presentation act took place of gold badges to members who have been loyal to the Club for 50 years. This important event was held for the first time in the Auditorium 1899. The president and the vice president Jordi Cardoner awarded the badges and the diploma to a total of 106 members of the 146 who were invited.

Silver badge presentation

In December the silver badges were given out to members who had been loyal to the Club for 25 years. Due to the number of members this year, a total of 1,012, the Club decided to hold 3 events on the 10th, 12th and 13th of December. The acts were held in the Auditorium 1899 and presided over by the vice president Jordi Cardoner, accompanied by the directors Pilar Guinovart, Eduard Coll and Josep Ramon Vidal-Abarca.



Joan Manuel Trayter, new member ombudsman

The Governing Board of FC Barcelona agreed to the appointment of Joan Manuel Trayter as new member ombudsman to replace Agustí Bassols, who has completed his mandate. The board would like to thank Mr Bassols for his contributions over the last five years. Joan Manuel Trayter Jiménez, who was president of the Club Statutes' Reform Commission (2010-2013) and vice president of the Catalan Sports Tribunal is a professor of Administrative Law at the University of Girona and has a PhD in Law from the University of Barcelona.



Accessibility – Sensitivity– Specialisation OAE (Specialised Service Office)

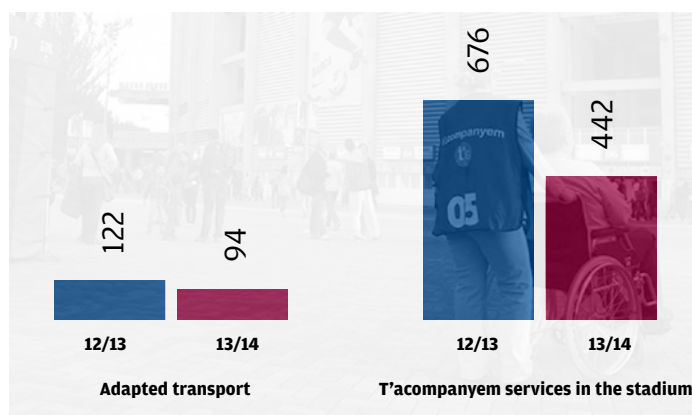
The OAE, whose purpose is to demonstrate FC Barcelona's sensitivity to people who suffer from any kind of disability or reduced mobility, continued to provide special and personal care. Personal attention and the number of mails and phone calls handled have increased enormously. With help from the Advisory Table the OAE also coordinated several actions to improve access to the Stadium and the adapting of facilities as well as improving ticket sale management in areas set up for wheelchairs, which contributed to increasing the number of ticket sales and the use of the Free Seat service by members of these areas of the Stadium.

Accessible website

On 3 December the Club's new accessible website was presented. Through the OAE, FC Barcelona is now more accessible to Barcelona members and sympathisers and to people with impaired hearing. Sign language users can now see information in the web's video texts. All the videos are subtitled to ensure complete accessibility for people with impaired hearing. Some of the FC Barcelona web contents are now adapted to Catalan sign language, Spanish sign language and the international sign language. All the texts are marked with an icon indicating whether they are accessible in sign language. The text in Catalan has Catalan sign language. Spanish texts have Spanish sign language and content in English is adapted to the international sign language. All the files in sign languages are also stored at the FC Barcelona Sign Channel so they can also be accessed through FC Barcelona YouTube. One of the most ambitious objectives for this season in the Social Area has now therefore been achieved. It is a global benchmark, the only team in the world, further to being audited, to receive the Double A (AA) certificate.

'We're with you'

This season the 'We're with you' service was consolidated and the number of services compared to the 2012/13 season has increased. The special service provided 112 services on the day of the referendum alone. The quality of the service is improving and every day we receive indications of satisfaction. Access staff is aware of the service and always cooperate, which helps the volunteers and improves the Club's image. From the start of the 2013/14 season, the OAE managed tickets for wheelchair access areas in the Stadium and almost 300 were sold. Exchanges were coordinated for members with temporary mobility problems and the specialised service managed to answer every question asked by users who may have mobility problems but who do not need a wheelchair and they were given the best solution for their problem.



Solidarity

3rd Member Solidarity Day

For the third year running, and on the first Cup qualifying round against FC Cartagena, the Club organized the 3rd Club Member Solidarity Day. The match was held in the Stadium on Tuesday 17 December at 10pm. A large number of spectators who went to the Stadium were able to do so thanks to acts of charity by members who offered up their seats totally free to entities and associations for disadvantaged social groups around Catalonia.

The Club carried out various actions to encourage collaboration by members in giving up their seats and as a result of this campaign a total of 45,492 invitations were sent out, 29,959 by the Club Foundation and 15,533 by the Social Area. The awarding of the 45,492 tickets considered the main associations all around Catalonia: children's homes, care homes, hospitals, disability centres, centres for the elderly, occupational and training workshops and the entire institutional network, such as local councils, the Catalan government committee, charity organisations such as the ONCE, the Red Cross, not-for-profit organisations and foundations.

A raffle was also held for 10 presidential watches and a t-shirt signed by the first team players. The winner was the member Montserrat Acuña



Manteca, who was given the shirt by the vice president Jordi Cardoner before the match.

The traditional photo with children at the beginning of the match was taken with a group of children from the Catalan Down's Syndrome Foundation, who had their dreams come true by being photographed with their idols.

Afterwards, an event took place to thank all the entities and associations who collaborated on the day and on sending out the tickets to the different associations. The event was held in the Auditorium 1899 and chaired by the vice president Jordi Cardoner and the director Pilar Guinovart. It was also attended by Ramon Terrassa, head of the general directorate of Civic and Community Action for the Catalan Regional Government.



Members' Day for feeding children at risk – Red Cross

To coincide with the last match of the League at the Camp Nou a charity appeal was made to gather funds to help children in vulnerable situations. The president of the Red Cross, Josep Marquès, was welcomed by president Bartomeu in the Presidential Box of the Camp Nou through the alliance between FC Barcelona and the Red Cross for helping hungry children.

The purpose of the Humanitarian Alliance for feeding children is to collect funds in order to obtain up to 100,000 aids and distribute them among children at risk. This action aims to collect a million Euro in order to be able to give out this food aid through various Red Cross projects. FC Barcelona helped boost this action by offering communication channels and spreading the word in the last League match at the Stadium.



Campaigns and projects

Updating the Membership List 2012/13

In October 2013 the updating process of the membership list 2012/13 was completed and at a press release the director Jordi Cardoner presented the results of the updating process, which lasted a year. This process, which started on 22 October 2012, was closed on 31 October 2013, although members who had not updated their status were still able to do so. On 30 June, a total of 139,573 had been recorded, of whom 103,125 are men and 36,448 are women.



Open Box

The Open Box is a special benefit that provides the possibility for members to be able to enjoy the match from the most privileged position of the Stadium: the Presidential Box. These lucky members are chosen from the entire membership list who are over eighteen in a draw in the presence of the vice president Jordi Cardoner.

As in the 2012/13 season, there were five winning members for each match, who were allowed to bring a companion. One of the five members is always a senator (the first thousand members of the Club) in recognition of the longest-standing members of the Club.



Open Box Palau

The Open Box in the Palau enables members to be able to enjoy a match from the Presidential Box. This season 2013/14 a form was drawn up and interested members were able to sign up. A draw was made from all members before a notary for the winners. This gave more chances to everyone of being able to attend the Box. Like the Stadium Box, there were 5 winners per match who were able to bring a companion. It was a phenomenal success and the initiative will continue next season in order to include as many members as possible.



Youth Open Box

The Open Box for the Camp Nou Stadium for young members is held once a year. It usually coincides with a match near Christmas to make it easier for younger members to attend and because these are dates that invite these kinds of activities for the youngest Club members. This year it took place on 14 December 2013, to coincide with the match against Villarreal.



Waiting list and new memberships for the Stadium

New memberships were generated for the Stadium in accordance with cancelled memberships during the season.

For the third consecutive year, the Governing Board decided to make available to members on a waiting list all the cancelled memberships further to the updating process. In the 2013/14 season there were 319 full members. Invitations were given out in strict chronological order of the waiting list and 219 memberships were allocated initially and 48 memberships during March.

On 7 January the annual process was completed to ratify registration on the waiting list for members to the Stadium, and in total 7,850 went to the OAB office to confirm registration.

Barça party

The second Barça party, held from 31 July to 2 August, was opened by the vice president Jordi Cardoner. One of the most popular attractions was the visit to the old Masia, which was opened up especially for this event. Visitors were able to look round the facilities where many of our players were trained. To help access, the Club provided shuttle coaches and during the journey a guide gave a short history of the Masia. The former player and previous resident of the Masia Guillermo Amor presided over the opening of the building.

The Barça Party, which was free for all members, fan clubs and companions, was attended by 14,385 people and 3,417 visited the former Masia.



Football League for Members

Once again the FC Barcelona members were able to wear the Barça shirt in another edition of the Football League for Members played at the Sports City facilities. The finalist teams played the last matches at the Camp Nou, coming out onto the pitch to the Barça anthem in the background. The social and sporting nature of the competition meant that over 500 members were able to meet up and use the FC Barcelona sports facilities.

For the first time too a prize was awarded for the best goalkeeper, the Ramallets Trophy, to pay tribute to the goalkeeper's job and the skill and responsibility involved in defending the goal.

The youngest members also enjoyed football training days and played a friendly in the Camp Nou, enabling them to realize their dreams of playing on the same pitch as their idols.



Barça is all about running

Barça is all about running is a league of ten 10km races around the Barcelona city area. *Barça is all about running* encourages non-competitive running in popular races to encourage a healthy lifestyle. These races are a meeting point for members and form a link between Barça fans and a love of running. To take part in *Barça is all about running* you need to be a member, friend of the Palau, fan club member or Futbol Club Barcelona employee and be over 16. In the second race 900 runners, members, employees, FC Barcelona fan club members took part in the ten races wearing the FC Barcelona colours. Taking part in *Barça is all about running* is free; runners just have to pay a registration fee for the races.

On Sunday 25 May at 10.45am the *Barça is all about running* trophies were awarded to all the winners in the different categories. The event was coordinated by the director Jordi Monés i Carilla as Director of the Medical and Performance area and Responsible for the Athletics Section jointly with Josep Maria Mir, director of the Athletics sporting commission.



Activities for children

All the young members received extra attention from the Club with special activities and benefits, a calendar of family events with special prices and festivities in the facilities for the whole family. In the 2013/14 season young members whose birthdays were on the same day as the Champions matches when Barça played Milan, Manchester City or Ajax were given a special and unforgettable present: the Club rewarded the families' loyalty by inviting the 22 children who were eight on the day of the match, who had been longest in the Club, to come out onto the pitch holding hands with the players as the Champions' anthem was played.



9th Barça Christmas Pictures

Over a thousand drawings were sent by Barça member children to say Happy Christmas from around the world. This time the illustrator Mariona Cabassa was given the task of selecting which one best represented Barça Christmas. The title this year was 'Barça's Christmas flag'.

An exhibition of all the drawings was set up in the Club's Museum and all members were able to visit it during the Christmas holidays. All the winning children, with their families, were able to celebrate Christmas in an unforgettable atmosphere in the FC Barcelona Museum during the prize-giving event in December 2013.



New projects Children's passport

This is a new social activity approved by the Governing Board that enables free access to the Camp Nou for member's children who are not members and under the age of eight.

What is the children's passport? It's a document that will allow children under eight to go to the Stadium without having to have an invitation. To go into the Camp Nou all you have to do is activate the passport. As the document has a barcode, the child will go through a turnstile. Access will be valid for one season. For the 2014/15 season the Member Child's Passport will be created, which is a new social activity approved by the Governing Board that will provide free access to the Camp Nou for members' children, who are not members, and aged under eight.

How does it work? The passport will be linked to a mobile phone application. From six days before the match the adult accompanying the child will quickly be able to activate membership for the match they wish to see. The application will assign them an entry door, which will be the one closest to the adult's seat. However, access is also possible from any of the doors enabled for child entrance. If the smart phone is not compatible with the mobile application the passport can also be activated through the club's website.



Museum –popular highlight

The Camp Nou Experience, which includes a visit to the Museum, the Tour of the Camp Nou and the Multimedia area was consolidated as one of the highlights for all visitors to Barcelona. This has meant that for ten years it has topped the list of museums most visited in Catalonia and the third most popular in Spain. In 2013 the Museum received 1,506,022 visitors. In the 2013/14 season, the Museum received its 25 millionth visitor. Àlex Jiménez and his two children, Estanis and Dídac, aged 10 and 7 respectively, were the lucky winners. All three, FC Barcelona members, were greeted by the vice president and the head of the Social Area, Jordi Cardoner, and by the Museum director, Jordi Penas and were given an exclusive tour of the Museum. They were also able to touch the pitch in the Stadium, knock about with a ball and enjoy a private visit to the first team's changing room. Estanis and Dídac were both also given commemorative shirts.



Special new features

- New access hall to the Museum. To coincide with the extension of the FCBotiga the access hall was completely refurbished with a new reception area and entrance control with automatic turnstiles. In this area all visitors to the Camp Nou Experience can now hire an audio-guide service in 9 languages as an essential accessory in order to find out in more detail the history and stories about FC Barcelona.
- The content of the area devoted to the FC Barcelona Foundation has been updated to adapt it to projects currently underway.
- The new area dedicated to Lionel Messi, opened last season, was consolidated as the most photographed by the thousands of visitors who go through the first floor of the Museum every day. This space has a replica of the four Golden Balls and the three Golden Boots he was awarded as the top goal scorer in Europe.

- Since June the Museum has had a new area devoted to women's football, which was instigated by the Edelmira Calvetó Group, led by the director Susana Monje. This area includes the eleven official trophies the section has won since it was started up, as well as the shirt and boots of Marta Corredra, scorer of the first goal at the women's Champions and a video that tells the history of Barça women's football since the 70s.



- In the summer of 2014 the tour included the Camp Nou Lounge, an area that enables people to enjoy a top quality meal like never before, with privileged panoramic views over the Stadium. This proposal forms part of the new features that FC Barcelona has prepared so that every visitor to the Club this summer can enjoy a fantastic leisure and gastronomic experience. The restaurant gives visitors to the Camp Nou Tour Experience the chance to have a break and enjoy the tranquillity of the Camp Nou stands when there is no sporting activity. There is a quality selection of food and drinks.
- On the second floor of the Museum the area devoted to legendary members and players has been refurbished and there are now three new areas:
 - An area devoted to the sponsor Qatar Airways where you can see the 'making of' the advert 'A team that brings the world together' as well as other objects used in the advertisement.
 - An area devoted to the application FCB Trivia Fans. This app is a free Q&A game with six categories: Players, Coaches, History, Matches, Trophies and Interesting facts.
 - A new area where you can see a sample of the remodelling project of the New Espai Barça, which was approved in a referendum by the Club members. This model gives an idea of the remodelling project for the Camp Nou, the Palau Blaugrana and the adjacent facilities.



News

The Fan Club movement, at a historic moment

The supporters' club movement is currently at a turning point in its history. All the hard work carried out since 2010 came to fruition this season. So much so, that the 2013/14 year got underway with two major organisational changes in the fan club association. First of all, the census of fan clubs was completed, which provided the total of fan clubs around the world. Almost 150,000 supporter clubs globally formed part of the movement as at 1 July 2013.

Furthermore, this season a new working method was started up successfully. The previous 35 areas, each represented by a delegate, became 30 territorial federations. Each federation has a team, a board of directors who work for the fan clubs in the territory, coordinating and promoting fan club activities in their area as well as conveying any concerns or proposals. The Fan Club Council is therefore made up of a representative of each of the federations, and has gone from an advisory role to an executive body.

This is mainly a result of a representative body that stems from the movement. Thus, it was the fan clubs themselves who at the time decided how they wanted to proceed with these new features, raising the fan club brand and carrying out and firmly consolidating the project Penyes Segle XXI, (fan clubs in the 21st Century).

One of the major changes in the 2013/14 season was in the statutes' reform. Since last October, with the approval of the new statutes by the Assembly of Delegates, the movement is now recognised by the Club and special mention was made of the number of clubs around the territory. And this is not all; the movement was also granted representation at the top governing body of FC Barcelona, as the territorial federation presidents are now delegates, with voice and vote at the Assembly.

Teamwork

Better Together

In recent years teamwork has been the prevailing recipe for the success of all the projects arising from the fan club movement. This method of working together is preferred, as consensus brings rewards and encourages self-management.

Four commissions that continue to make progress

The four themed commissions that were set up at one time during the Fan Club Council are also working tirelessly for the movement and proposing all kinds of projects in their field. This season, the Camp Nou, Tickets and Travel Commission played an especially important role in terms of the New Espai Barça. The members of this commission collected in their territories suggestions to ensure the project approved by members in the referendum contains all the proposals and special features possible.



From the moment when the thirty territorial federations were first set up, the Communication and Marketing Commission began working on the possibility of drawing up a sponsorship plan for the federations to make sure fans are the final beneficiaries, either directly or indirectly. With regards to communication, this commission established the guidelines for projecting the force of the movement abroad, in order to raise the fan club brand awareness.

Meanwhile, the Acts and Activities Commission continues to mark the protocols for events that represent the Club, and the various activities organised by the fan clubs. For its part, the Standards Commission aims to keep adapting the rules for fan clubs, in accordance with the progress and agreements they assume.



Global Fan Club Meeting

Solidarity, the movement's mainstay

The movement also has a Solidarity Council, devoted to coordinating all activities of a solidarity nature. Whether these are events organised by the fan clubs or longer-standing projects led by the Club, the Solidarity Council takes part in logistics, promotion and coordination to ensure their success.



The Fan Club's World Congress

The Fan Clubs world congress is the top representative body of the movement and is where the fan clubs democratically decided on the direction the movement should take and to which they should belong. This season the 34th Edition was held on 1 and 2 August in the Catalan Congress Centre to coincide with the Joan Gamper Trophy. From suggestions and decisions taken by each commission, the Fan Club Council discusses which direction to take, and has the authority to ratify them or reject them. The aim is that sound decisions from each area are presented, in line with the World Fan Club Congress presentation, which then aims to discuss, as important issues, the representative model of the territorial federations in the Congress and the resulting adapting of the fan club regulations. The new coefficients of ticket allocation was also established, from the recently completed census of fan clubs.



The global meeting continues at home

For the third year running, and to coincide with the Gamper, the Global Barcelona Fan Club Meeting was held at home in the FC Barcelona facilities. As one of the events in the Barça Party, the fan clubs added colour to the area reserved for members and fan clubs. The Card Game Tournament reached its second year with great momentum. Its success was spectacular, with a total of 80 pairs who finished the evening with a popular dinner in the Fan Club marquee in the site. Children also had their moment, with the second Fan Club's Football Games, the football videogame tournament that was played on the same day as the Gamper. The most institutional touch was the event that kicked off the Global Meeting, the first day of the Barça Party. This was the presentation dinner of the directors of the territorial federations. At the setting up of this new organisation, it was a good way to start working on synergies among each of the areas.



Sport

Fostering values among the youth

One of the principal objectives of the *Penyes Segle XXI* project is to reach the youngest fans. Success in the future of the enormous amount of work being carried out nowadays for a solid and constantly growing movement in terms of quality and quality will depend on them. This is why two large projects got underway in which the youngest fans learn about values inherent to sport, such as hard work, sacrifice and teamwork, as well as healthy diet and hygiene habits .

Success at the 8th Football 7 Tournament

The movement's excellent social tournament returned to the ministadium annexes for what is now its eighth year. Eleven U12 twelve teams and ten U10s compete in this tournament, where the most important thing is being able to enjoy two days with other fan clubs. Eleven of the 30 areas were represented. Over 300 boys and girls came from all over, from Tarragona to Venezuela, from Galicia and the Canary Islands, to be able to enjoy the Club's facilities and the Gamper, while they added colour to the Barça party.



A Club and Group project

If there is one pioneer group in youth sport in the fan club world, it is the FC Barcelona Football Group of Clubs and Fan Clubs. With a history and recognition by the Club dating back 60 years and over 20 fan clubs and 3,000 players in almost 300 teams from the school to the U18 categories, its stability is more than demonstrated.

This 2013/14 season the Group and the Club started an encouraging project aimed at fostering partnership among fan clubs as well as values amongst younger members. In March, the Selection of Fan Clubs of FC Barcelona was set up: and the U12 team made up of players from all the



fan clubs in the Group. The main aim of this team is to foster the values of the Club wherever they go and to correctly represent the Club on the pitches, in tournaments or friendly matches under the institutional representation of the former player Paco Clos.

The opening was held in April at an international friendly, in which the Fan Club Selection received in the annexes of the Ministadium the soccer team from the Barcelona Fan Club in New York. The match result was not important, as the winners in any case were the players, and also the fan clubs. In June, the Selection, also in both categories, took part in the 1st Manel Montalbán Memorial tournament, which is a triangular tournament held in Mont-ras as part of the events for the anniversary of the Palafrugell Barcelona Fan Club.

Social days

Also headed by Paco Clos, and in close collaboration with various trainers of the youth section, another project for younger members was also set up: the Social Days. These are for children aged between 8 and 12; through sport emphasis is placed on the importance of healthy habits. Ontinyent, La Granada, Collsuspina and Vidreres attended these sporting cohabiting days. The disadvantaged areas of Badalona, Montcada i Reixac and Canovelles also attended, under the premises of the Solidarity Council and tireless cooperation by the local fan club and the corresponding territorial federation.



Events

The Fan Clubs, more alive than ever

Once again the fan clubs proved themselves worthy ambassadors of FC Barcelona in the area, representing Barça wherever they go. A total of 529 events took place: anniversaries, meetings, popular celebrations, charity events and others. Of these events, 234 were represented by officials from FC Barcelona. The president Josep M. Bartomeu attended the 50th Anniversary of the Montillana Barcelona Fan Club. Vice presidents Jordi Cardoner i Casaus, Jordi Mestre, Javier Faus and Manel Arroyo also attended various fan club events along with the directors Pau Vilanova and Josep-Ramon Vidal-Abarca and the members of the Social and Fan Club Commission, members of the Barça Players Association and other Club commissions such as Sports.



Presence at the Club's facilities

In addition, a total of 21 shields were inaugurated at the Camp Nou. The fan clubs still feel the emotion of leaving their mark at the home of all Barça fans and the trend remains of coming on a match day to draw back the curtain on their shield before the match. But in the long-term, the movement is concerned for the Barça facilities. Almost 1,000 supporters, in representation of 400 fan clubs, attended the three briefing sessions before the referendum for the New Espai Barça, thus showing their commitment to future projects, while at the same time strengthening the Governing Board's commitment to listen to every suggestion so that, once updated, the Club's facilities will be as functional as possible.



A solidarity movement

Led by the Solidarity Council, solidarity acts are increasing and expanding throughout the group. Solidarity has been local and intense, especially during the Christmas festivities. Activities were carried out that were widely reported, showing the world that the fan clubs also know how to make Barça through solidarity. Thus, at the end of the season, the East Barcelona Fan Club Federation organised a football 7 tournament for research into Duchenne muscular dystrophy. The Fanatiek FC Barcelona Limburg supporters' club brought over a Beetle from Belgium to help a young fan aged 7 with Dravet's syndrome. For each kilometre, sponsors donated between 0.5 and 1.5 Euro. Also, they also offered €150 for each signature on the car's boot. The Governing Board naturally took part in this initiative.

The Knokke-Heist Barcelona Fan Club, from Belgium, thanks to public donations, collected enough money to build three drinking water wells in Cambodia, which currently serve five families in the area. The Barça Fan Club Polska hung up a giant poster in Gdansk for the friendly against Lechia on 30 July. In December they brought it to the Camp Nou, where it was cut up into 50 x 50 cm pieces to be sold. The collection went to needy children in the country.



Service Care

An office worthy of our movement

If in the 2012/13 season the Fan Club Service Office moved to the new Social Headquarters, during December a series of improvements were carried out to achieve excellence in customer care. During the 2013/14 season over 14,000 emails were managed, 8,000 phone calls were received and 5,200 fans were attended in person.

Opening hours were linked to the OAP's service hours: from Monday to Friday, from 9 am to 8pm non-stop or until 15 minutes after the start of a game at the Camp Nou. On Saturday matches, it opens at 10am until 15 minutes after kick-off, while on Sundays or holidays it opens from two hours before and 15 minutes after kick-off.



Ticket procedures

Furthermore, a large number of tickets were handled, in particular for people who have to travel, close to 20,000 locations, including purchasing made through the fan club website, and also the final of the King's Cup. Around 500 solidarity tickets were also managed for local institutions the fan clubs had requested as part of the Free Seat solidarity initiative for home matches in the first round of the King's Cup. The youngest fans were also able to enjoy promotional tickets at €1 for fans under the age of 14. Over 1,700 tickets were sold.

OAP Online, a significant leap towards self-management

The OAP Online was consolidated this season. The fan clubs manage the fan club census and convey any changes of address, governing board, etc. Over 200 changes of management and more than 300 changes of headquarters were notified and the census of each of the official fan clubs was updated.

Communication

We continue to improve in communication

The fan clubs will remember the 2013/14 season as the one in which the made great progress in communication. They exceeded a million and a half fans on supporters' club Facebook, and also 100,000 followers on Twitter. This proves the tremendous interest the fan clubs generate on social media.

Information: easier to access

The changes made to the fan club website enable general information to be accessed more easily and at any time. It is divided into four large blocks: the 'carousel' of news, general information about the movement, the movement's entities and the OAP, and specific information about tickets, etc.

This enables the user to access useful information such as speeches from the Global Congress, the advantages of the Fan Club Passport, or how to apply for the Commitment Passport for fan club presidents simply and directly.



4th 'what a fan club! season

Llucà Ferrer's team is still travelling the country to find the best fan club for her nephew, getting to know them in -depth and informally. Every week, the programme goes out on Barça TV.

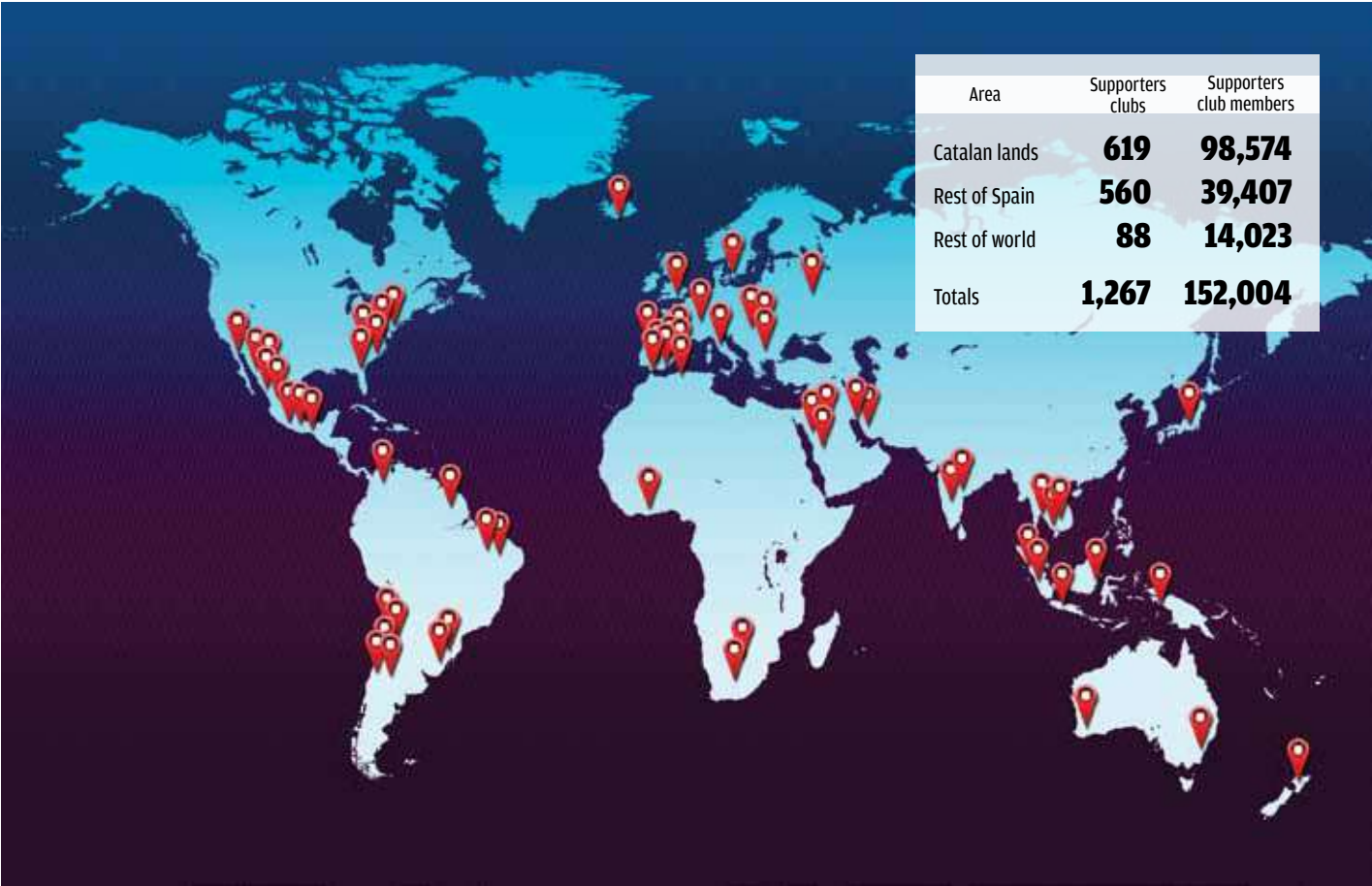
Fans' corner

Undoubtedly, in terms of communication, the major news this season was start-up of the sections 'the fans' corner' and 'find your fan club' in the BARÇA MAGAZINE, which comes out bimonthly. Keeping their boots on

For another season, the Association of Barça Players (ABJ) performed their activity of providing service to former players of FC Barcelona and helping the Club spread Barcelonism through sports activities in the various teams and institutions. For the second consecutive season an increase of their activity was possible thanks to the 0.5% contribution that a large part of the Club's professional football members give to the Association. In this regard, the organisation's leaders had the chance to thank them personally for this donation and to inform players of the First Team, Barça B and Juvenil A of the activities carried out by the ABJ. Last season the headquarters of the Association was renovated and adapted to members' needs, updating its image.

Closing the circle

The Association gave out periodic financial aid to 43 former Club players during the 2013/14 season, a figure that had increased compared to the previous year. Meanwhile, in order to provide resources and new skills to veterans who need them, the Association offered in-class courses on technical sports training, (scouting, use of video in sport, nutritional guidelines for sportspeople) and other transverse training such as English and computers. To help all former players access the training an online training platform was also started up. In total there were 173 former players registered on the Association's courses in the different modes.

Close to the Club

The 2013/2014 season saw a dramatic increase in participation by the Association in events organised by the FCB fan clubs. Thus, former Club players were present at 99 fan club activities, in addition to the directors and contributing added value to the most important events. Another highlight was their collaboration in the final stage of the programme *Youth Solidarity*, promoted by the FC Barcelona Foundation and the Association's involvement in the briefing campaign about the New Espai Barça, which took place during March and required their active participation in 28 of the sessions organised to disseminate the Espai Barça proposal initiated by the Club and that was subjected to referendum in early April.

On another institutional note, the Association once again organised the campaign *Get hooked on sport*, aimed at promoting sports and preventing risk behaviour among young people, with days in Salou, Calella and Sant Celoni. Towards the end of the season another project was started up in collaboration with the IESE business school, in which two groups of students from the centre shared a sporting and technical morning with former Club players to identify and experience common values between business and sport.

Also active on the pitch

The Association's sporting activity also focused on maintaining weekly training sessions for former FC Barcelona players, which were held on the Ministadium's training pitches. They also took part in a total of 26 fun matches with around 200 former players of all different ages and categories. Qualitatively, involvement by the Medical Services was outstanding in monitoring the condition of the former players taking part in the sports activity. Apart from the celebratory matches or matches to commemorate centenaries of Catalan clubs, the Association's main commitments abroad took place in Oman, where in March the Legends team won the Oman Legends Match playing against veterans from Real Madrid (2-1); in Berlin, where the indoor football trophy was played before a large and enthusiastic public, Istanbul, where a friendly match was organised with veterans from Galatasaray and lastly in Dubai where for the third time the Association took part in the International Football Tournament.



Social Activities

For increasingly more former players the Association has become a reference point that connects them directly to their era as Barça footballers. Thus, organising sporting but also social activities enables them to maintain ties and keep up with old and new colleagues. The two most intense moments of the Association last season were the Annual Dinner, which was presided over by the president of FC Barcelona, Sandro Rosell, and the Players' Meeting, which was held in Calonge and Palamós with huge attendance. Other activities included the Folga 65 for former first team players over 65, matches and the season's final dinner, the presentation of books about Rodri and Paulino Alcántara, a trip to Verona, a cruise around the Greek islands and other leisure and cultural activities.



A double by Xavi at the Barça Players Award

Xavi Hernández was the winner of the 4th Barça Players Award, organised by the Association and sponsored by Estrella Damm beer, to acknowledge the cleanest play by the FC Barcelona Player in the 2012/2013 season. Xavi, who also won the previous year, collected the award at an event held at the beginning of the year in the Auditorium 1899. At the end of the League the campaign was started for the fifth year of the Award, which went on until June. Later on a jury will decide which of the six players with the most support in the popular voting campaign will receive the award.



'We're still playing', a new window for the Association on Barça TV

In October the programme *We're still playing* went out for the first time on Barça TV. It is dedicated to the Association today and to remember those who have made the Club's great history. In each episode, which lasts half an hour and goes out monthly, a description is given about the main sporting, social and institutional activities of the Association along with reports on the various areas of activity and also on former players in the history of Barça.



Casal de l'Avi Barça

Members of the Barça Casal de l'Avi (club for retired members) held a party on 10 April in the Auditorium 1899 as part of the celebrations of the 25th anniversary of its inauguration. The event was attended by the president Josep Maria Bartomeu and the vice president Jordi Cardoner, who made opening speeches. Bartomeu devoted words of praise to the more than 250 Casal members at the Auditorium and spoke of their undertaking to "create Barcelonism". The president also reminded everyone that currently "FC Barcelona has around 27,000 members who are aged over 65" and that thanks to the New Espai Barça project their association's facilities "will be improved". "We are keen for the Casal to become even more popular", Bartomeu added.

Martí Dalmases, president of the Casal, had a very well-kept secret for everyone attending. At the end of the event Joan Manel Serrat appeared. By just walking onto the stage he received tremendous applause. The singer songwriter from the Poble Sec area of Barcelona was eager to take part in the celebrations and enjoy the final part of the event with the association's members.

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Institutional Area

Josep Maria Bartomeu, new president



On 23 January 2014 Josep Maria Bartomeu i Floreta took on the presidency of FC Barcelona until the end of the mandate, 2016, due to the resignation of Sandro Rosell after three and a half years in the position. Bartomeu, previously vice president of sports, became president number 44 in the history of the Club and the new leader of the project that won the elections in 2010.

The new president of FC Barcelona assumed this new chapter as a continuation to the Governing Board's management, while marking it from the beginning with his own profile. "The Statutes indicate that we follow the Governing Board and also say that if the president resigns the vice president takes over. I formed part of a candidature with the most votes in the history of the Club. I believe the project has not been completed, there are still very important challenges to be undertaken and we are very excited about moving forward".

In his first parliament as president he explained his road map. "All our challenges and goals remain in force. The football first team and our sections will continue to receive our utmost support and the resources necessary so we can keep aspiring to the top. This is a club owned by its members and we will do all we can to consolidate it and reach our destination, at the most difficult time in its history".

Extensive directorship experience

Josep Maria Bartomeu (Barcelona, 6 February 1963) has been Barça member 16836 since 1974.

He has been a member of the Governing Board since 2010, when the candidature led by Sandro Rosell imposed the elections held on 13 June.

Since then, until his nomination for Club president, he had been first vice president responsible for the Sports Area, participating actively in the sports planning of Barça football and in all the signings, transfers and renewal operations jointly with the sports director Andoni Zubizarreta. With a wide range of experience as a director, Bartomeu also formed part of the FC Barcelona Governing Board from 2003 to 2005 responsible for the basketball section and he became the Palau man.

Married with two children, he is a partner and CEO of the companies ADELTE Group (engineering for ports and airports, world leaders in boarding solutions and in the design of transport vehicles for large loads) and EFS, Equipo Facility Services (a group of service companies for comprehensive maintenance of terminals and electro-mechanic equipment).



Titles and economic recovery, Sandro Rosell's legacy

Sandro Rosell, in accordance with the Statutes, presented his irrevocable resignation as president of FC Barcelona before the Governing Board on 23 January 2014. From then on, the first vice president, Josep Maria Bartomeu, immediately took on the presidency effective until the end of the mandate.

Rosell had won the elections on 13 June 2010 with 35,021 votes (61.35%), a record amount of support. As president, he started up a project marked by four main objectives: maintaining the sporting excellence the football team had enjoyed since 2008; promoting youth football; a financial austerity policy due to the economic circumstances and encouraging social participation.

Sports-wise, under his presidency, a total of 60 titles were won, 53 of the professional sections (10 in football, 10 in basketball, 13 in handball, 7 in roller hockey and 13 in futsal and 7 awards achieved by the women's football). One particular highlight of these titles is the fourth Champion's League (2010/11) and the second Club World Cup (2011/12) in the history of FC Barcelona. As an outstanding achievement, the 17 official titles won by the professional sections in the 2011/12 season set a new record in the history of Barça.

In terms of formative football, another highlight was the inauguration on 20 October 2011 of the new Masia, Oriol Tort Training Centre, the facilities in the Joan Gamper Sports City.

The financial aspect was crucial. He applied austerity measures aimed at reducing the Club's debt, which went from being 430 million Euros net in 2010 to 331 million three years later. Thus, the 2011/12 season achieved record profits of 49 million Euros and the 2012/13 season closed the year with a surplus of 32 million.

In the Social Area, members were reinforced as owners of the Club with a statute reform that provides more power to members, encourages participation and establishes the mechanisms to guarantee financial control of the Club. Meanwhile, he also set up the member census and updating of the waiting list.

New Governing Board Organisation Chart

The Governing Board underwent changes during the financial year 2013/14 further to the change of presidency, which resulted in a correlation of positions. Javier Faus is now the first vice president; Jordi Cardoner, the second and Carles Vilarrubí the third vice president responsible for the Institutional Area and also International. Jordi Mestre was appointed fourth vice president and is responsible for the Football Sports Area. The board gained a fifth vice president, a position held by Manel Arroyo, who is responsible for the Media and Communications Area. The new organisation has also been modified. While Pau Vilanova joined as the new director of the Social Area and head of the fan clubs, Eduard Coll and Pilar Guinovart departed.

Coll, who was responsible for handball, presented his irrevocable resignation and his position as head of the section will be taken over by Susana Monje. Guinovart, meanwhile, will stay at the Club as senior director of the OAE (Specialised Services Office).

Within the board itself there were also changes. The appointment of Jordi Mestre as vice president meant that two directors took on responsibilities for the Club's lower level categories. Silvio Elías is responsible for Barça B and Juvenil A, while Ramon Cierco –up to now roller hockey– is the new director of formative football.

Josep Ramon Vidal-Abarca continues in the Security Area, a position that he combines with responsibility for the roller hockey team.

Toni Freixa continues as secretary of the Governing Board and is also president of the Disciplinary Commission. Javier Bordas, as well as director of futsal and the FC Barcelona representative in the RFEF, is responsible for relations with the national football federations to which the Club's professionals belong.

Institutional Events

Peace Tour

FC Barcelona travelled to Palestine and Israel on a historic trip to strengthen institutional ties with the leaders of the two communities and establish dialogue for peace, as well as enjoy direct contact with many Barça fans around the Middle East. The first stop on the *Peace Tour* was Palestine, where the Barça delegation was welcomed by the president Mahmoud Abbas, visited the Basilica of the Nativity and received people at the Dura stadium, which was attended by 24,000 people. The next day they visited the Wailing Wall and held an official reception with the prime minister Benjamin Netanyahu and the president of Israel, Simon Peres, at the presidential residence. The day ended with a second reception at the Bloomfield stadium in Tel Aviv, attended by 15,000 people.



The Edelmira Calvetó Group instigates a women's football area in the Museum

The Edelmira Calvetó Group, which is led by the director and treasurer Susana Monje and includes the director of the Social Commission, Pilar Guinovart, as well as the Foundation patrons Lola Bou, Rosa M. Lleal and Marta de Llauder, was created in 2011 to vindicate the role of women and sportswomen in FC Barcelona. It is named after the first female member of the Club in 1913. This working group has brought about the creation of an area in the Museum devoted to women's football. The inauguration event was attended by the president Josep Maria Bartomeu, the vice presidents Jordi Cardoner and Jordi Mestre, the director Pau Vilanova, the Edelmira Calvetó Group and a hundred guests, including representatives of the pioneers in the 70s, players who won the first trophy of the section, the Queen's Cup in the 1993/94 season, and the current women's team A, coached by Xavi Llorens.



Barça celebrates Catalan National Day

A Barça committee led by the vice presidents Vilarrubí and Cardoner and including other directors and trainers of the professional sections, members of commissions, representatives of the youth football, as well as the Association of Barça Players made the traditional floral offering to the Rafael Casanova monument. The Camp Nou was also the crossing point for the Via Catalana organised by the Catalan National Assembly (ANC).



FC Barcelona receives National Sport Award

FC Barcelona received the Stadium Cup, which rewards the association or person who has stood out for their special contribution throughout the year in promoting sport. The Barça president, Sandro Rosell, accompanied by the vice president Carles Vilarrubí and the directors Eduard Coll and Manel Arroyo collected the award -corresponding to the year 2012- at a ceremony held at the Prado Palace in Madrid and presided over by the Royal family. This is the fifth time that FC Barcelona has been awarded the Stadium Cup. It also received it in 1925, 1941, 1957 and 1997.



Adherence to Diplocat

FC Barcelona now forms part of the plenary board of trustees for the Public Diplomacy Council of Catalonia (DiploCat), where it will be represented by the vice president Carles Vilarrubí, responsible for the Institutional Area. The Public Diplomacy Council of Catalonia is an institute created in November 2012 as a public-private consortium aimed at explaining Catalonia to the world and inciting International public opinion in order to reinforce the image and prestige of the country abroad, creating ties and relationships among citizens and institutions of Catalonia with those from other countries.



FC Barcelona, recognised by the European Lung Foundation

The European Lung Foundation (ELF) and the European Respiratory Society (ERS) acknowledged the joint campaign by FC Barcelona and the European Commission *Quit Smoking with Barça-Deixa de Fumar amb el Barça* with the ELF Award 2013 at the Annual Congress of the ERS. The campaign, which aimed to help millions of smokers around Europe give it up and enjoy the benefits of a smoke-free life, is the first initiative of this kind between a large public institution and a top global sports club. 'Quit Smoking with Barça-Deixa de Fumar amb el Barça' was well-received by the media and scientific community as it emphasises the long-term benefits of stopping smoking.



Promoting Barça and Catalonia in Manchester

To coincide with the Champions League match against Manchester City, FC Barcelona promoted Catalan culture and Catalonia as a tourist destination through various events in the British city. The main event took place at the Faculty for Languages, Linguistics and Culture at the University of Manchester where a meeting was held, jointly with the Ramon Llull institute, about Barça and the Catalan culture around the principal conference theme 'Barça, Sport, Culture and Education' given by the vice president of the Institutional and International Area, Carles Vilarrubí. In another event organised jointly with the Catalan Tourism Agency and the Chamber of Commerce in Barcelona, Catalonia was presented as a tourist destination through a speech by the director of the Club's Economic Area, responsible for Patrimony, Jordi Moix.



The Aldo Rovira award for Leo Messi

Leo Messi received the Aldo Rovira award for the 2012/13 season. This is the third time Leo Messi has won the award, having been awarded it previously in the 2009/10 and 2010/11 seasons. This prize, which was given by the father of Aldo Rovira, Josep Lluís, his widow Sílvia, and his children Clàudia, Aldo and Lucas, is given out annually and is awarded by a jury made up of directors and heads of Catalan sports media.



New delegates chosen through a draw

The draw for FC Barcelona delegates who will have a vote in the Club's General Assemblies for the 2014/15 and 2015/16 seasons was carried out through a computer process. A total of 8,060 numbers was extracted, of which the first 4,030 that satisfy the conditions according to Article 23.1f of the FC Barcelona Statutes, will be designated delegates as of 1 July until 30 June 2016. The act was chaired by the vice president for the Social Area, Jordi Cardoner, and the secretary of the Governing Body, Antoni Freixa.



Institutional visit to the Joan Gamper Training Complex

The Minister for Planning and Sustainability, Santi Vila, and the mayor of Sant Joan Despí, Antoni Poveda, accompanied by the president of FC Barcelona, Josep Maria Bartomeu, and the director responsible for Patrimony, Jordi Moix, made a visit to the Joan Gamper Training Complex in reference to the future urban transformation of the area. The Training Complex site occupies a surface area of 129,308 m², which will be extended by 20% with the recent acquisition of the adjacent site that belonged to the Tennis El Forn, where the new Ministadium will be built.



Reinforcing commitment against cancer

To coincide with World Cancer Day the president Josep Maria Bartomeu and the director Jordi Monés during the League match against Valencia received representatives from various hospitals and patient associations.



Meeting with the president of the Red Cross

To coincide with the last League match at the Camp Nou, the president of the Red Cross, Josep Marquès, attended the Presidential Box and held a meeting with the president Josep M. Bartomeu about the alliance between FC Barcelona and the Red Cross for feeding needy children. The event was also attended by the vice president Jordi Cardoner and the director Pilar Guinovart.



Another award for the 'Smoke-free Barça' project

FC Barcelona was recognised by the AECC-Catalonia against Cancer in Barcelona for its social care aspect in the fight against cancer and the implementation of the project *Smoke-free Barça* and its success. The director responsible for the Medical Services, Jordi Monés, collected the award.



The Roller Hockey Veterans Association is created

The aim of the Barça roller hockey veterans association is to bring together everyone who has been linked to the section throughout its history, which includes former players, trainers, delegates, assistants or managers.



FC Barcelona welcomes the Global Editors Network Summit

To coincide with the annual congress of the GEN (Global Editors Network), the Camp Nou was chosen as the venue to close the summit. The president of FC Barcelona, Josep Maria Bartomeu, hosted this meeting for the extensive but select representation of the media from around the world that had met in Barcelona for the congress. The GEN is a non-governmental and not-for-profit organisation led by Ricardo Kirschbaum, managing editor of the Clarín group in Argentina. The 24 members that constitute the Board of Directors come from leading global media such as the BBC, *Le Monde*, CNN, *El País*, *Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung*, *The Guardian* and *India Today*, among others.

Tito Vilanova and Barça handball receive awards

FC Barcelona was one of the protagonists at the 17th Catalan Sports Festival. The coach Tito Vilanova received the Sporting Spirit Award and the Barça handball section won the prize for Best Men's Team.



The Ernest Lluch conference on Economy and Football

Further to the agreement established between FC Barcelona and the Ernest Lluch Foundation, the 2nd Ernest Lluch Conference on Economy and Football was held in the Roma room at the Camp Nou. The event was chaired by the FC Barcelona president Josep Maria Bartomeu and the president of the Ernest Lluch Foundation, Joan Majó. It was focused on football statistics and an analysis of the influence on objective assessment of players in the market and on the structuring of financial and sports strategies by clubs through the use of statistics packages through new technologies that parameterise the elements that constitute football.

At the Homage to Catalan Clubs Gala, FC Barcelona collected 19 awards in the football, basketball, futsal, handball and athletics disciplines.

Communications Area

Worldwide Media coverage

The global media once again consistently monitored information relating to FC Barcelona during the 2013/14 season. Coverage by hundreds of Catalan, Spanish and foreign media was once again exhaustive, as has been the norm for many years. Once again, follow-up was not only limited to information about the football first team but it also focused on the professional and amateur sections of the Club, as well as information about FC Barcelona in finance, social and cultural areas. International and often well-known and prestigious media continued to be advocates with an extensive presence of special reporters and correspondents who came to cover matches, follow-up press releases and write a huge number of articles.

In terms of football in the Camp Nou, once again the figure of 10,000 match accreditations in one season was exceeded, in addition to season passes already held by many media. Thus, there was in excess of 500 media professionals per match. The record of accreditations in a single match was 805 professionals - for the final League match against Atletico de Madrid.



From the arrival of Neymar to the arrival of Luis Enrique

The 2013/14 season was dominated by the star signing of the summer, Neymar Jr, one of the most coveted assets in the global market. The magazine devoted the first pages to explaining the inside story of the Brazilian signing.

Tito Vilanova had started the pre-season as trainer but had to give it up to devote all his energies to fighting the illness with which he had been diagnosed a year and a half previously. Edition 64 of the magazine published the open letter from Tito to fans explaining the reasons why he was standing down and expressing his thanks to everyone who had expressed concern for his condition.

The second edition of the six bi-monthly magazines focused mainly on Tata Martino, Vilanova's replacement on the bench and who took over the team after the pre-season had already started. The issue in December explained in-depth the member census updating process and gave an example of a family of long-standing Barcelona tradition, that of Gerard Piqué and his grandfather Amador Bernabeu, who make up four generations of Barça members.

The February-March 2014 edition was dedicated to the handing-over of the presidency between Josep Maria Bartomeu and Sandro Rosell, after the latter resigned. This issue also included the figures about the signing of Neymar in an unprecedented exercise of transparency in the world of football.

The next issue focused on the Referendum of the New Espai Barça and the project's content, which was then approved by 72% of members who voted. This number included all the information about the new Camp Nou, the new Palau, the construction phases and the financing plan. The last publication of the season contained a picture of Luis Enrique on the front cover, who will be responsible for constructing the new Barça. Inside, the technician from Asturias explained his ideas on taking on his third Barça stage during his journey from player to technician of the affiliate.



Documentation Centre

The Club's Centre for Documentation and Studies continued its mission to facilitate the history of FC Barcelona to interested parties. The media, individuals, fan clubs or the Club's internal departments themselves receive any information requested about the history of FC Barcelona. In fact, Barça TV, the BARÇA MAGAZINE and the FC Barcelona website use the Centre as a fundamental support tool. Nowadays, any in-depth research about Barça's past must be backed up by the powerful document source represented by the Centre for Documentation. Furthermore, during the 2013/14 season the Centre for Documentation increased the volume of its library by including 76 new works. This makes a total of 926 monographs and 247 titles of journals related to FC Barcelona and sport. Also this year the multimedia archive became fully operation. This is a new working tool for cataloguing all images generated within the club. The project's ultimate aim is to ensure this material is preserved and can be recovered, as well as overseeing its proper distribution. During the 2013/14 season 48,000 images were catalogued.



Barça TV celebrates 15 years consolidated as the club's audiovisual flagship

Barça TV achieved its objective of becoming a benchmark medium for Barcelonism during 2013/14. After 15 years of broadcasting, the official FC Barcelona television channel consolidated its TV project, in which quality, accuracy and entertainment are combined with a clear vocation to address members and Barça fans.

Last year the Barça TV listings continued to include historically popular programmes such as Barça Notícies, El Marcador, ADN Barça, Porta 104, Quina Penyal, Promeses and +Club. It has also gradually added further programmes such as Som-hi Palau!, Tot Barça and El 9.

The first team were the protagonists of most of the Barça TV shows. Repeats of all the season's matches continued to be broadcast; both official matches and friendlies. Information is given about the team's everyday events in terms of training and travel, and live and repeated press releases with players and the coach are also broadcast.

The programme El Marcador continues to be extremely popular on match day and is the programme with the highest audience on the channel.

Other popular programmes are those specially devoted to new signings, such as Benvingut... Interviews with Carles Puyol on his retirement and Leo Messi's interview in which they looked back over their years in Barça's youth training team also had high ratings.

Once again, Barça TV has continued to show its solid commitment to live sport and, more specifically, youth football and women's football. Over 100 live and repeated matches have gone out and of special note are the matches played between the Juvenil A team in the UEFA Youth League, the live broadcasting of the historic final won against Benfica and the brilliant progress of the women's first team in the League and in the Women's Champions League.

The professional sections have received particular attention on Barça TV this season. More live matches than ever have been broadcast than in the 15 years of the channel's history. Once again, the futsal team were the stars of the weekend listings with live or repeated broadcasting of official competition matches.

Barça TV has also paid special attention to other sections. This season 15 matches of the handball first team were broadcast live, another 15 of roller hockey and 14 of Barça B basketball. A commitment to live matches and daily follow-up of the teams' activities has made Barça TV an informative reference point of the Club's sections.

As in every season, Barça TV has continued to make special programmes about all the professional section teams whenever there is a title in play. More than ever, Barça TV has been a showcase for FC Barcelona's institutional activity. The programme +Club is the informative reference point of the Club's social activities. The Delegates' Assembly, the Global Fan Club Congress, sessions of the Foundation Forum etc. were broadcast live.

This year, the New Espai Barça project featured highly in Barça TV's listings. Information capsules have gone out explaining the project's main features, a daily monitoring throughout Catalonia has been made of the New Espai Barça touring exhibitions and in particular an extensive rollout of information on the day of the referendum in which Barça TV viewers were kept up to date hourly about how this historic day was unfolding. Barça TV therefore completes 15 years of history. On 27 July 1999 a new, innovative and pioneering television experience came into being: a football club's themed channel that year after year has grown in scope and quality and that is now a mandatory reference point not just for Barça fans but also for sports lovers in general.

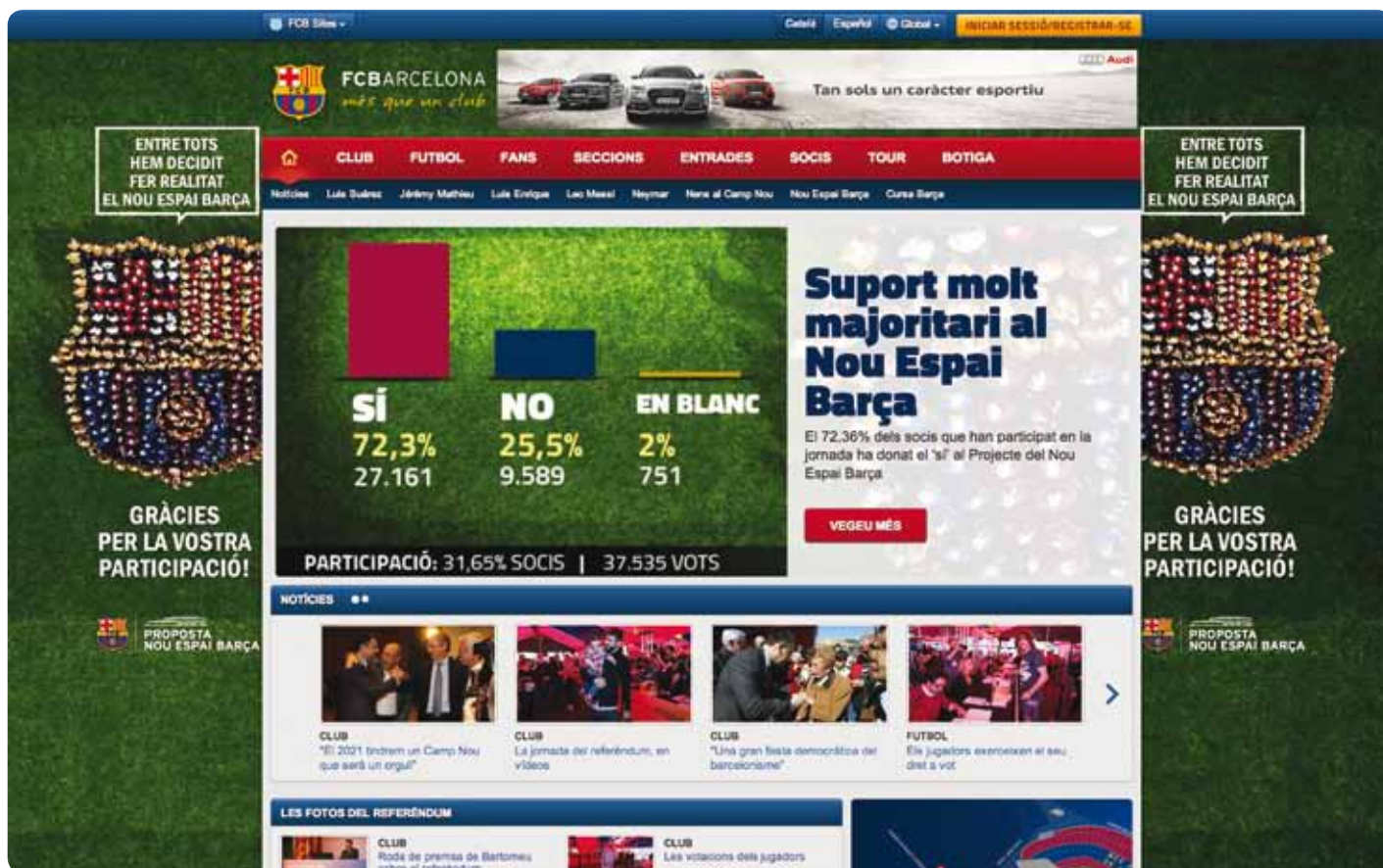
Barça's digital leadership

FC Barcelona's digital platform has been consolidated as the essential reference point for latest news and entertainment by all Barça fans. Its 68 million users certify this, in a season in which the number of languages to access Barça content has been increased to nine. The arrival of Neymar Jr was accompanied by the first version in Portuguese, which can be seen at www.fcbarcelona.com.br, and which is added to the versions in Catalan, Spanish, English, Chinese, Japanese, Indonesian, Arabic and French. The club's global vocation was reinforced with more content adapted to the characteristics of each country and re-designing of the home page.

Aimed at becoming a meeting point for Barça fans around the world the project 'Barça fans' also got underway. This space (www.fcbarcelona.com) offers exclusive content, the chance to take part in promotions and enjoy benefits. To access, you just have to register free of charge.

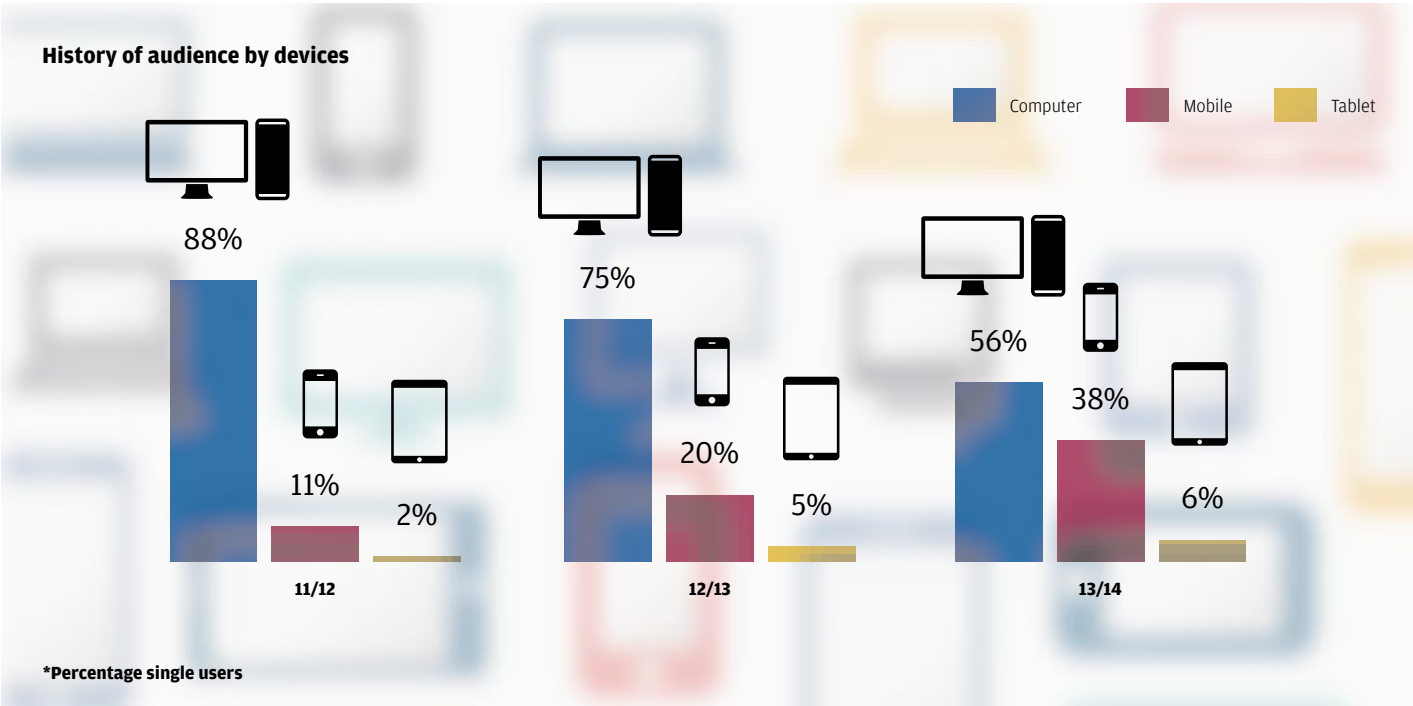
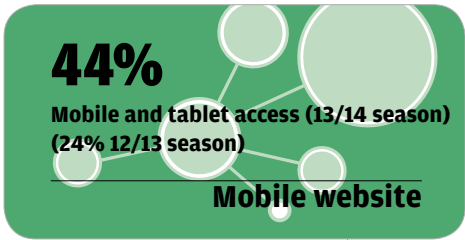
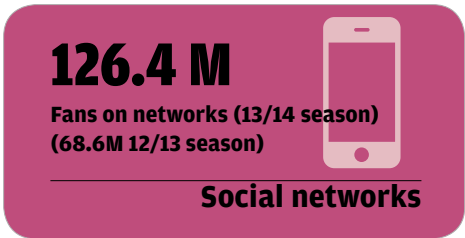
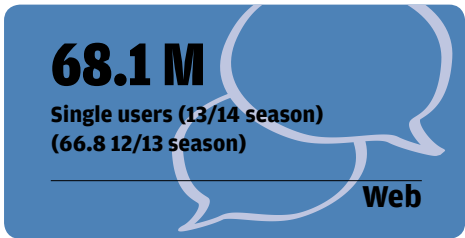
A commitment to audiovisual content in the local day-to-day of the first team's footballers was one of the most popular new trends. This can be seen by the 87 million reproductions on YouTube about FC Barcelona in the last 12 months. Particularly popular was the video that showed inside events at a League Classic at the Camp Nou, which received over two million visits. Also, new multimedia narratives were included, with infographs and the use of content curation tools, in particular from social media. This is because FC Barcelona is still the number one in the world in this area, with over 126 million followers in all platforms. It continued to be a leader among the sports clubs around the world, including the North American franchises, on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube, to name a few. This growth was encouraged by the presence of Line and Sina Weibo, two social media networks originating in Asia.

In this season, FC Barcelona, which aims to guarantee universal access to



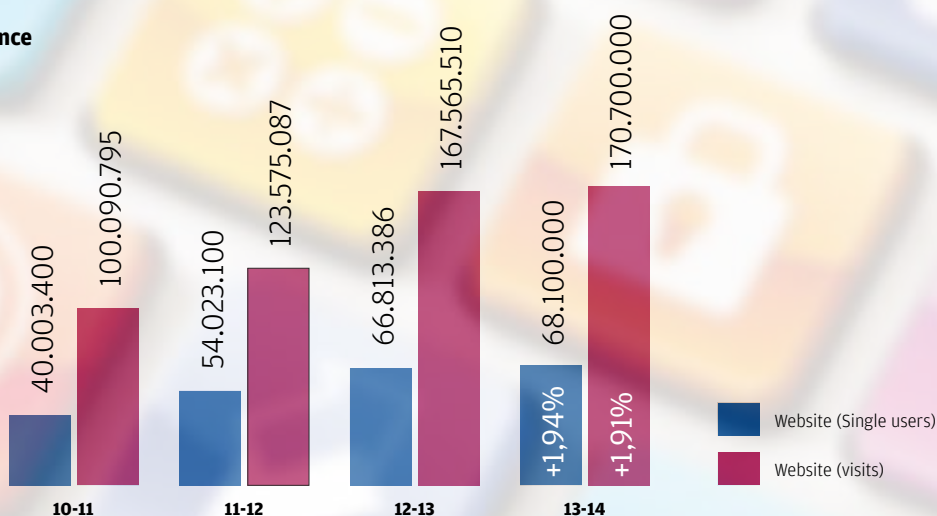
its information by all users, became the first European sports club to obtain the AA accessibility certificate. The home page was optimised to enhance access for disabled groups who find it difficult to access information. For people with hearing conditions, the main videos about the Club's history and services were translated into sign language. The Club's website has been guaranteed to be compatible with web interpretation programmes for visually impaired people and keyboard browsing was improved for people with physical disabilities and/or reduced mobility issues. In parallel to all these changes the Club worked hard and applied the principles of 'web responsive' design whereby the website can also be adapted into all the languages in which it is published in any kind of device: mobile phones, computers or tablets. This progress is particularly important when considering recent shifts in digital consumption habits: in the 2013/14 season 44% of users accessed the website via smart phones or

tablets, much higher than the 24% of the previous season. Bearing in mind this trend, the Club developed a new application (in Catalan, Spanish and English) that enables optimum managing of the Free Seat service. This app enables members to free up their seat in the Camp Nou and also the Palau (basketball) easily and quickly. If plans change, the application also enables the seat to be recovered. In the first weeks of use, 15% of seats released were managed through this new channel. Likewise, ticket sales via mobile phones were also popular: as of April the interface was much better and had been adapted for new uses. Another growth was that of Barça member use of the website for Club relations and sorting out procedures (changes of name, address, bank account...) online. 31% of these procedures are now dealt with online, rather than going in person to the OAB. This trend has also increased compared to the previous season 2012/13 (23%).

Over 100 million fans around the world



Barça has become the first football club in the world to exceed 100 million fans in the social media in which it is present. It is the first sports club in the world to achieve this record, which reinforces its leadership in the 2.0 environment.

The hashtag #FCB100M was used to celebrate this historic milestone with all Barça fans on the planet. Players, members, employees and fans

from all around the globe celebrated the 100 million with exclusive photos that went viral on the Club's social networks.

One figure sums up the magnitude of this centenary milestone: Barça every day gains over 100,000 new followers on its pages and official accounts on social media. Barça is the sports club with the most followers in the leading social media around the world.

During the season the FCB social website was set up (<http://www.fcbarcelona.cat/club/barca-2-0/fcbsocial>) on which you can find information in real time about all the Club's social profiles, as well as sharing all events occurring on the FC Barcelona social networks.



Facebook, over 67 million

The official FC Barcelona page on Facebook exceeded 67 million fans on this leading social network. In the last season, the number of followers increased by 25.9 million, ratifying its leadership position in the global world of clubs and sports associations, which includes the NBA, the UEFA and the Premier League.

Meanwhile, in the 2013/14 season geolocalised messages were further promoted for countries around the world in order to accommodate the social and cultural sensitivities of Barça followers.

Another highlight is that Barça has become the first club in the world to use a 'Questions and Answers' (digital conversation in real time) on Facebook. This enabled Barça fans to interact with the first team player Cesc Fàbregas. The conversation between the player and fans generated over 230,000 likes.

This 2.0 interview was recorded under the formula #CampNouLive to interact with followers all around the globe.

In March, after the Real Madrid-FC Barcelona match at the Santiago Bernabéu stadium, a record number of likes was generated for an article on Facebook, with over a million.



YouTube, more views than ever

This is the season with the most views on the channel YouTube. There were over 87,827,591, which is 25.74% more than in the previous season. Audiovisual content is becoming more popular and this season we were able to enjoy exclusive content in pre and post matches, as well as the most incredible ball command and goals by the youth teams. Gradually, during the season we exceeded a million subscribers to the official YouTube channel and the season closed with around 1.4 million subscribers.

More specifically, the promotional video by Qatar Airways as the new Barça sponsors was the most viewed video in the history of the FC Barcelona YouTube channel with 4.4 million views.



Instagram, over 2 million

Instagram was consolidated as one of the most interactive social media among Barça fans. This season there were over two million fans and the Club led various initiatives such as the website #igersFCB, where you can see all the players' Instagram profiles, or a competition 'one anthem, one feeling' by which fans around the world completed the Barça anthem with their own photos.



Twitter

With 24.5 million followers this social network (with figures increasing compared to the previous season by 33.1 %) presence on Twitter was consolidated with accounts in Catalan (@fcb Barcelona_cat); Spanish (@fcb Barcelona_es); English (@fcb Barcelona); Arabic (@fcb Barcelona_ara); French (@fcb Barcelona_fra); Japanese (@fcb Barcelona_jap); Indonesian (@fcb Barcelona_id) and Brazilian (@fcb Barcelona_br).

The Twitter in English account obtained 12 million followers and the three main accounts (Catalan, Spanish and English) totalled over 22.9 million. The combination of last minute information about Club events and the minute by minute experience of the first team matches means the number of fans keen to stay up-to-date through this social network is increasing every season.

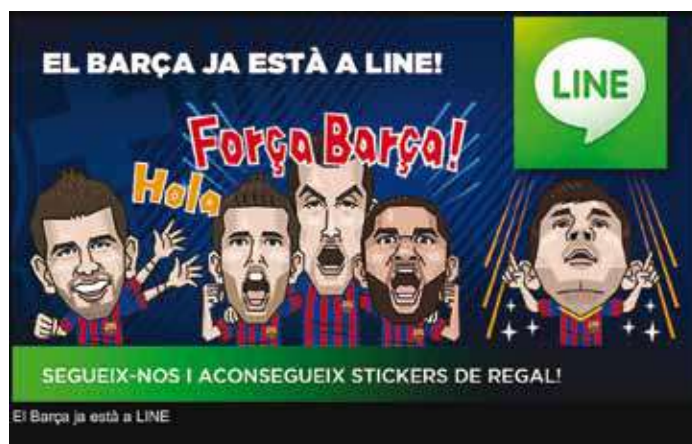

Social platforms for smart phones

Consumption in social media is increasing dramatically through smart phones and tablets. Thus, this season the strategy on social networks was transformed to reinforce their multi-platforms. First, FC Barcelona appeared on the instant messaging application LINE, opening English, Catalan, Spanish and Japanese, Brazilian and Indonesian profiles. In all these profiles there are around 14 million users in these accounts, of which the most popular is the English account, with over 8.5 million followers. In parallel, the personalising of the user experience on LINE was encouraged with first team player stickers and the use of Barça motifs through the application for smart phones LINE Camera.

The Club inaugurated an official account on BlackBerry Messenger (BBM) (available in Catalan, Spanish and English) to share all its contents on one of the fastest growing platforms in the world.



2.0 expansion in China

FC Barcelona now has 3.1 million followers on Tencent Weibo and has expanded its presence in China with over 2 million more on the other microblogging network in the country, Sina Weibo. By reinforcing the audience of the Chinese version of the Club's website, the specific content created for the Chinese New Year and the Catalan Tourism Competition in China has enhanced communication with Barça's Chinese fans.







Economic Area

The best Barça shop in the world

The new FCBotiga Megastore, opened in late 2013, provides customers with a unique innovation and technology experience. Located in the Camp Nou premises, it offers a technological and digital yet at the same time personal experience with services that make it the best Barça shop in the world.

The new Megastore gained 500 m² from the former Paris room and now covers 2,100m² spread over three floors. It now contains the best collection of official FC Barcelona and Nike Football products and clothing, shoes and accessories. One of the main new features of the new Megastore is the spectacular 16 metre led light screen over the entrance and the traditional stands in the form of the stadium. Another innovation is the tactile digital screen on all three floors, on which the customer can personalise his/her Barça shirt and then, practically without having to wait, pick it up at the Engraving Workshop. Another new feature is the Megastore's exclusive service 'Make it Barça', whereby fans can choose their favourite Nike product and Barça personalise it. This option can be complemented by sharing the design from the Megastore itself on social media and publishing it on the *Social Wall*.

The new FCBotiga store offers all these new features while still keeping the services it already offered such as personalising football boots and the unique area for Barça's professional sections of basketball, handball, futsal and roller hockey. Also, it is linked up to the museum by a walkway so you can enjoy a completely unique Barça experience.

The FCBotiga Megastore receives around four million visitors every year and its refurbishment, fifteen years after it was first opened, has afforded it more space and a significant improvement to the quality of service, where customer



experience has been enhanced and the best product collection is available.

Meanwhile, another important event in recent months was the starting up of the official online FC Barcelona shop, integrated in the platform nike.com (nike.com / fcb), with its own collection and exclusive products. As part of the partnership between Nike and the Club the FCBotiga online offers the best digital purchasing experience for fans all around the world.

Also importantly, the licensing business continues the strong international expansion it has enjoyed in recent seasons, guaranteeing greater presence of official FC Barcelona products around the world. Indonesia has now joined the list of countries with official FC Barcelona products.

Some of the most significant growths were experienced in Mexico and Central America, the USA, Turkey, the Nordic countries, the Middle East, South Korea and China.

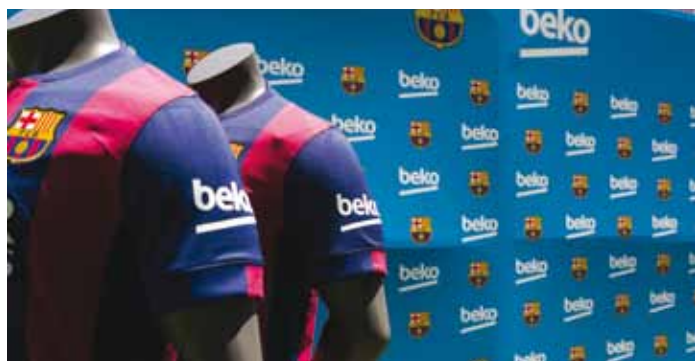
Qatar Airways. Change of beneficiary

On 1 July 2011 the agreement that Qatar Sports Investment signed with FC Barcelona came into effect. As of 1 July 2013 QSI agreed on a change of beneficiary from Qatar Foundation to Qatar Airways. The airline has increased the level of its sponsorship activity and began resolutely by broadcasting an advert that revolutionised the sector.



Beko

FC Barcelona and Beko reached an agreement by which the international white domestic appliance brand became the Club's global sponsor for the next four years. Through this agreement, the Beko logo will appear on the sleeve of the official shirt the first team players wear in State competitions, the League and the King's Cup, as well as friendly matches and tours. Beko has therefore become the first commercial brand to be present on the shirt sleeve permanently.

FC Barcelona reached an agreement with Intel, the world famous computer multinational, to become the Club's global sponsor until June 2018, which will mean that FC Barcelona is one of the most technologically advanced clubs in the world.

The partnership spirit between the two entities is reflected on the FC Barcelona playing shirt, which carries the Intel logo inside.

FC Barcelona and Gatorade have reached an agreement by which Gatorade has become sponsors of sports nutrition of the football first team. Gatorade will provide isotonic drinks to the Club for the next three seasons and also places its products on the Camp Nou benches, in the team's changing rooms and the press rooms. Furthermore, the Club has access to the prestigious laboratory, the Gatorade Institute of Sports Sciences, where all kinds of tests can be performed to provide nutritional support and advice to the Barça players.



Replay

The prestigious Italian clothes brand has been dressing the first team in almost all their season's trips with different formal outfits that make sure they don't go unnoticed and as part of the global sponsorship deal that will last until June 2017.



Maurice Lacroix

FC Barcelona has reached an agreement with Maurice Lacroix by which the Swiss watch manufacturers will become the Club's official sponsors for the next three years. During the agreement, Maurice Lacroix will be present on various advertising supports, one highlight being the marker of the fourth referee. Also, they will design exclusive watches for the players of the football first team.



Stanley Black & Decker

A sponsorship deal has been signed with Stanley Black & Decker by which the global tool suppliers become official Club sponsors. The agreement, which will be in force until June 2017, will be reflected through the electric, manual and safety tools of the group's brands such as STANLEY, BLACK+DECKER, DEWALT and FACOM.



Tecate

The recognised Mexican brand of beer has become a regional partner of FC Barcelona for the next five seasons in Mexico, one of the countries with the most Barça supporters.



Castle Lager

FC Barcelona gets close to its followers in Africa with a new regional sponsorship deal with Castle Lager. The agreement includes promotions to be able to visit Barcelona and attend matches in the Camp Nou.



Suning

FC Barcelona signed the first sponsorship agreement in history with a Chinese partner. Since the 2013/14 season and up to the end of October 2015 Suning has been the regional partner of FCB in China as FCB Official Electrical Retailer.

The presentation event, which was widely reported by the Chinese media, took place in Nanjing with the presence of the Club's general manager, Mr Antoni Rossich.



Samba

Is the new banking sector partner in the Saudi Arabian territory, which will develop association, marketing, digital and promotional rights in the country until 30 June 2016. In the Camp Nou they can offer hospitality to their guests in VIP seats throughout the season.

United Arab Bank

Is a new partner for the United Arab Emirates for retail banking. The agreement, which in theory will be in force until 30 June 2016, enables United Arab Bank to associate its brand with that of FC Barcelona, something that has a high impact in the territory. Meanwhile, they can also offer their guests two VIP boxes in the Stadium.

IronFX Global

FC Barcelona and IronFX Global signed a partnership agreement by which IronFX Global becomes an official Club partner globally, except in Spain. Until 2017, the global Trading Online company is the beneficiary of various rights of association and marketing and promotional rights.

Allianz

The insurance sector giant signed a new agreement to complement the one held locally, giving it worldwide outreach until 30 June 2015. The new partner took advantage of the Club's assets to give further notoriety to its campaigns "Football for Life" and "Something that matters".

**Serveto**

FC Barcelona and Serveto reached a sponsorship agreement by which the logistics company becomes an official partner of the Club's professional sections. Serveto becomes the first partner, after Nike, with presence in all the Club's professional sections at the same time (basketball, handball, futsal and roller hockey).

**Renewals****Coca-Cola**

The Club and Coca-Cola have renewed their partnership agreement in which the drinks brand is associated as Official Partner of FC Barcelona until the 2014/15 season. Thanks to this agreement Coca-Cola will continue to be the Club's official drink in Spain.

Avea

Avea, Official Telecom Partner for Turkey, which had been an FCB partner since 2011, renewed its ties with the Club from 2013 to 2017, and almost tripled its investment in order to guarantee its most precious assets, the FCB Campuses in Turkey.

Our Turkish partner in the telecommunications sector complemented the renewal of its prior agreement with a new agreement to implement two new FCB Escola centres in Istanbul. This agreement will last officially until 30/6/2016.

**Procter & Gamble**

FC Barcelona and Procter&Gamble, the company that owns Head&Shoulders, made effective their option to extend their partnership agreement until March 2015. With this contract extension, Head&Shoulders will continue to be the official shampoo of the Club in Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam, Malaysia and Singapore.

Freixenet

The Freixenet Group renewed and will continue as Official Partner of the Club until the 2015/16 season.

Morabanc

The Andorran bank renewed its agreement as Regional Partner of FC Barcelona. MoraBanc established the agreement with Barça in February 2010, an agreement that enables the banking group to enjoy advantages with exclusivity in the Andorran banking sector.

Qatar Airways

FCB-Qatar Airways presentation agreement

On 27 August 2013, the Auditorium 1899 held the event to celebrate the official presentation of the sponsorship agreement between FC Barcelona and Qatar Airways, which from 1 July 2013 has been the Club's global main sponsor. The alliance will continue until 30 June 2016, when the contract signed in 2010 with Qatar Sports Investment will come to an end.

Filming the Qatar Airways advertisement:

The story focuses on Julietta, a cabin crew member of Qatar Airways who lands in "the land of FC Barcelona". She comes off a Qatar Airways 777 and takes a unique journey through FC Barcelona land until reaching the Camp Nou. During the trip, Julietta meets some of the Club's most famous players, from past to present, and views the history of FC Barcelona until she reaches the fans, in the heart of the Club. In ten days the advert became the most viewed video in the history of the Club's YouTube channel, the video with the most likes on the channel (22,000) and the one that was most shared (13,000 times). The general manager of Qatar Airways, Al Baker, said: "The advert gives life and personality to the partnership". Months later a new three-minute video was presented which, under the name *The land of FC Barcelona*, shows in detail the 'making of' this sponsorship campaign.



FCB-QR painted plane

The football first team players, along with the president Josep Maria Bartomeu, the vice president of the Economic Strategic Area, Javier Faus, and the general manager, Antoni Rossich, on 14 May 2014 welcomed to the El Prat airport the Boeing 777 designed to show the association between FC Barcelona and Qatar Airways. This was the first time that the plane with the Barça colours painted on the fuselage had landed in the city of Barcelona.

The captain and the crew also had the chance to be photographed with the Barça welcoming committee. This Boeing 777 currently flies around the airline's entire global network, including Bangkok, Singapore and Bombay.

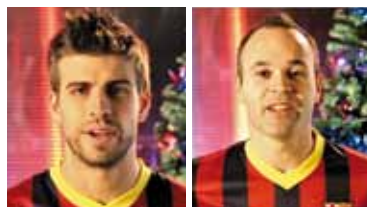
Chinese New Year: The Year of the Horse

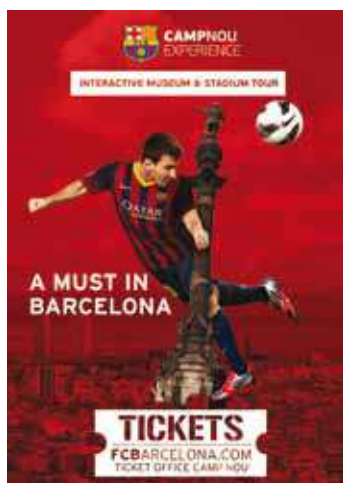
Christmas Celebration

Barça continued, as in previous seasons, to enable the public to access the Palau by attending open day trainings and watching coaches, players and technicians in the different sections as well as taking part in games and prizes with them.

The open day training sessions enabled over 9,000 people to enjoy the basketball, futsal and handball festivals in the Palau.



Visits to schools

The sections also went into schools with visits to over a dozen centres. These visits encouraged an inter-relationship between children and the Palau Blaugrana sections. Bringing the sections to schools had a dual purpose: on the one hand to promote the sports among young people and on the other to promote the Palau to increase fan presence in the stands.



The players were received by a huge gathering of children holding Barça flags while the Barça anthem played in the background. The activity included giving the students flags, t-shirts, Barça merchandising products and exclusive discounts for tickets to the Palau, which, through the presence of the media, meant the visits had a significant impact.



In total over 5,000 children from schools around Catalonia were able to enjoy these visits by the players to their schools' sports areas and playgrounds, giving them unforgettable memories.

Final Four Hockey Palau

This season the FCB organised the Final Four of the European Hockey League at the Palau Blaugrana, played by two Catalan teams and two Portuguese teams: Barça, Moritz Vendrell, Benfica and Porto. Over 5,000 spectators enjoyed Barça's triumph in an exceptional environment.

For a further year the number of members who gave up their seats when they could not come to a match continued to increase, enabling other fans to come to the Stadium.

Hospitality Programme: Vip Boxes and seats

The hospitality department took on new challenges this 2013/14 season by gradually adopting a much more commercial aspect, not only with the VIP boxes and seats in the Camp Nou but also showing companies, agencies, channels and groups all the products FC Barcelona can offer in its facilities. Even though the current financial climate is somewhat complicated for companies, and, therefore, for FC Barcelona's Hospitality product, its strong commercial efforts meant that it achieved a turnover of 11 million Euro this season, with 200 companies that form part of the Hospitality Programme.

For match sales new complementary products were introduced on purchasing tickets, in order to enable VIP ticket holders to enjoy an even more special experience and increase turnover.

In the coming season 14/15 the aim is to continue developing these commercial developments, increasing presence at trade fairs and commercial activities and continuing to improve the product, the infrastructure and service to achieve excellence in the FC Barcelona Hospitality product.



Meetings & Events

The M&E department continues to grow. In the 2013/14 season it increased its functions and took on the coordination of all events (non-sporting) promoted internally in order to provide service to the various Club departments and specifically the coordinating of events for members and fan clubs, extraordinary press releases and any kind of event or institutional act, thus optimising the Club's own resources. Throughout the season 260 events were organised, including Club events and commercial events for companies and individuals who wished to enjoy the products and services offered by FC Barcelona.

Despite the increase of its functions, the commercial section of Meetings & Events once again achieved and exceeded its objectives set for the 2013/14 season, with the production and coordination of events for a total turnover exceeding 2.5 million Euro. The range of products and services is increasingly extensive and an example is the variety of events organised in the Club's facilities: friendly matches among national teams, company incentives with over 1,500 participants, parties and large family events, weddings, large conventions and even dinners on the Camp Nou pitch during the summer months, to name a few.

One of the season's new features was the launching of the new FCB Megastore with a space to hold private corporate events outside its usual opening hours, while guests can still purchase products. Also, the Auditorium 1899, opened in the previous season and located in the new Social Area was consolidated as the area for the Club's large events and was the venue for the seasons' major presentations and institutional meetings.

Turnover

Gates takings

Further to the highest turnover ever in ticketing in the 12/13 season, this season 2013/14 it was impossible to maintain the level and turnover dropped by about 5 million Euros. This decline was due to three specific matches: not playing in the semifinals of the Champions League and there were two fewer matches against Real Madrid compared to the 12/13 season.

Global turnover in ticketing was 43.9 million Euros, a figure that represents a drop of 10.6% compared to the 12/13 season.

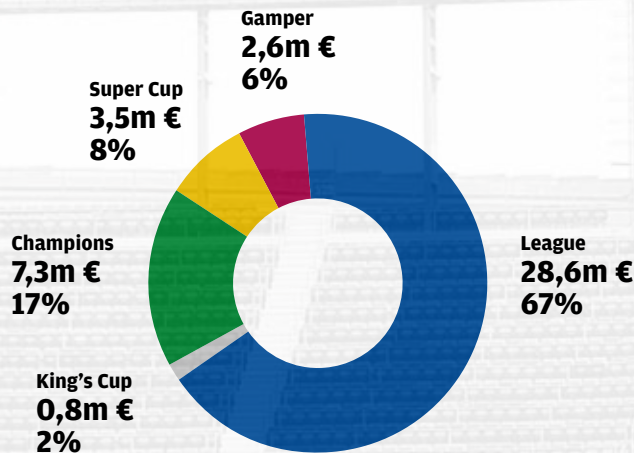
income for tickets sales for the Camp Nou behaved very differently depending on the competition.

In the League, a considerable increase of 6% was achieved after two seasons with a similar turnover level.

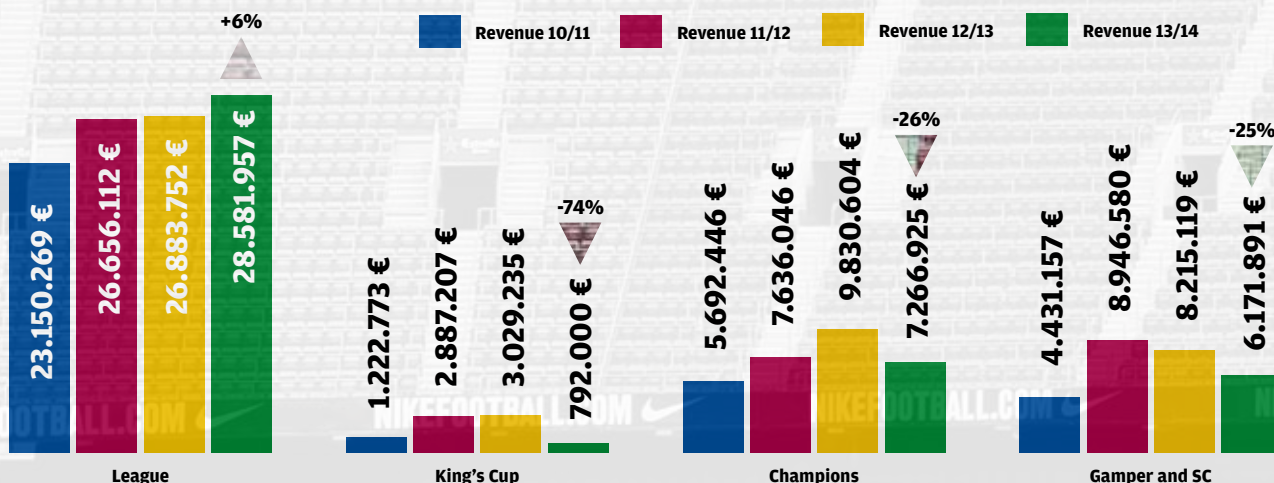
In the Champions, despite enjoying an average income per match higher than the previous season, sales dropped by 26% due to the elimination of the team in the quarter finals. The King's Cup was the competition with the worst behaviour, largely due to unfavourable timings and due to the lack of attractive rivals in sporting terms (the previous season there was a Barça-Madrid in the semifinals).

Sales of the Gamper doubled compared to last season, even though this did not compensate for the decline of the Super Cup (-52%) caused by the different attraction of the rival (At. Madrid 13/14 vs. R. Madrid 12/13).

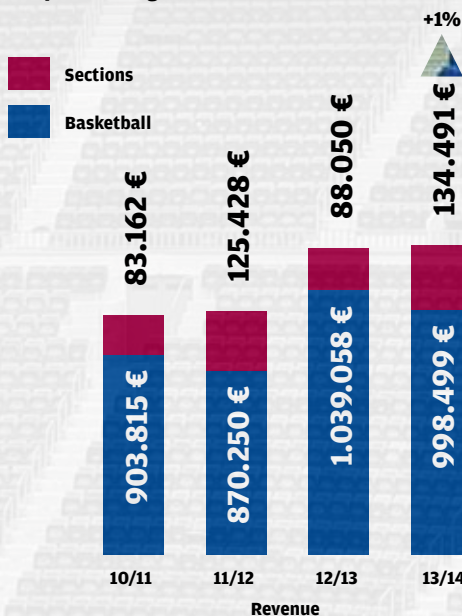
Income 13/14 by competition

Palau ticketing

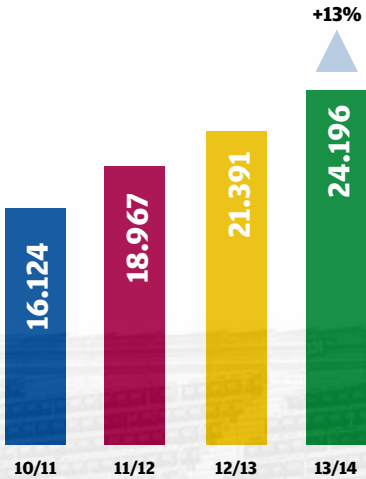
During the 13/14 season the Palau turnover increase achieved in the previous season was consolidated with a turnover level of 1.1 million Euros (+1% vs. 12/13). Basketball enjoyed a good level of sales throughout the season and only the fact of playing two fewer matches prevented the turnover from being higher than the 12/13 season. Sales for professional sections rose dramatically compared to the previous season with +53%, in a season in which the Palau hosted the Final Four of hockey, the final of the Asobal Cup and significant qualifying rounds of the Champions League of handball.

Seient Lliure

The use of the Seient Lliure (Free Seats) has grown into double figures among members with season tickets and for the second season running achieved an increase of +13% compared to the previous season. During the 13/14 season over 677,000 seats were released and 57,000 more than the 12/13 season, even though there was one fewer match, meaning a new record was obtained. The average of releases during this financial year exceeded 24,000 seats per match. The King's Cup was the competition with the highest average of seat releases while the Champions had the lowest.

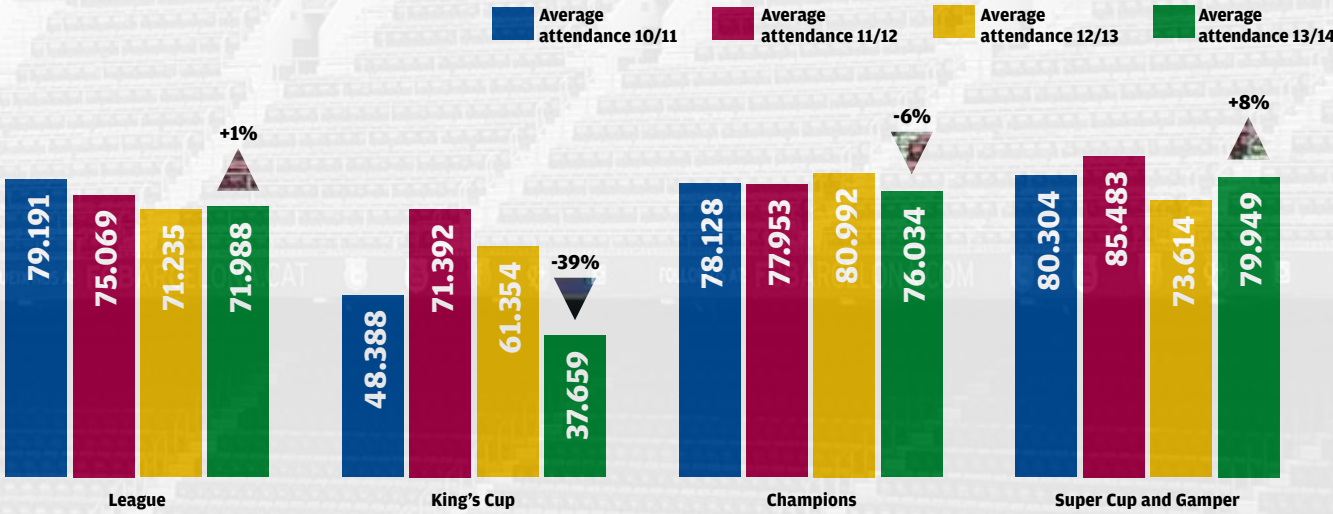
Evolution of number of average seat releases per football match



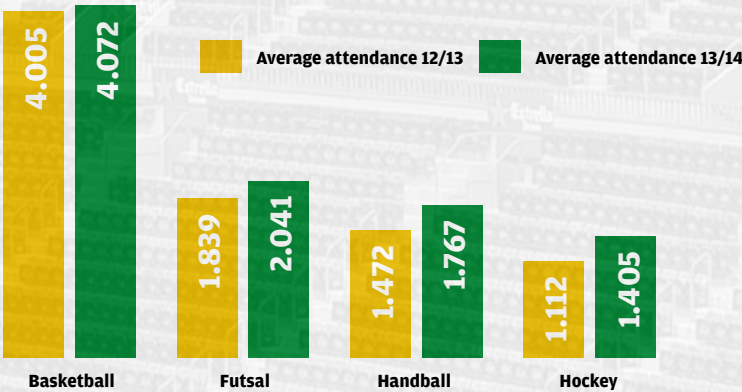
Attendance

Global attendance at the Camp Nou diminished by about 5% compared to the 12/13 season, largely caused by the drop in spectators at the King's Cup (-39% vs. 12/13). After three consecutive seasons with fewer spectators in the League, the trend was then reversed (+1% attendance vs. 12/13).

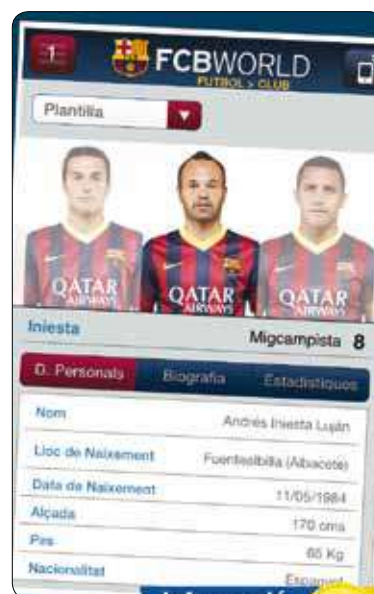

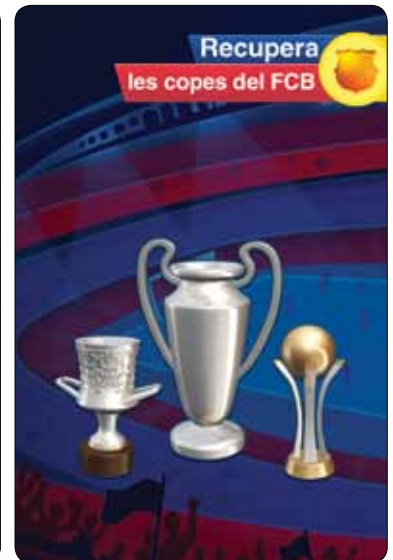

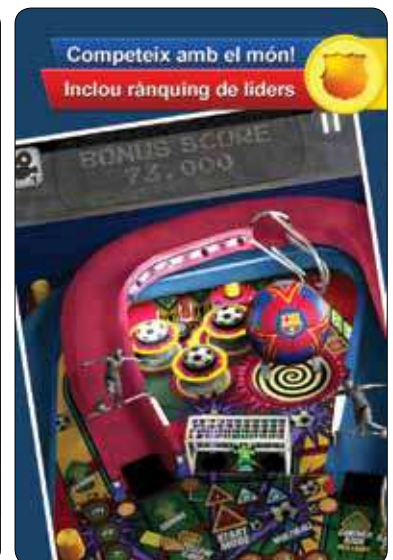

New road access 14 and pedestrian access 15

Accesses 14 and 15 were adapted to Club requirements in order to improve pedestrian and vehicle coexistence and the second phase of the project for improving the exterior area was completed.

Access 14 became a road access for vehicles going in and out of the different facilities and car parks of the Stadium. It has an extensive entrance with a large LED information screen for visitors.

Access 15 became a pedestrian access to a large square covering 1,500 m² with a replica of the Canaletes Fountain. This square has 16 changing rooms (one of which is adapted for the sensory disabled) and with the bridge and pedestrian walkway joins up the Social Space and the Commercial Axis.

Thanks to these changes the main accesses to the Stadium are now 14 and 15 and the Club has been opened up to the Les Corts neighbourhood, the essential idea of the Espai Barça project.

Pedestrian crossing from the joining of access 15 with access 9 (Passeig Boulevard)

The crossing for pedestrians only is the part that forms the union between the Social Space and the Commercial Axis. Differentiated from road crossings to avoid the long-standing conflicts between pedestrians and vehicles. It is marked in blue to avoid confusion by visitors and also serves as a route guide to the Zona Boulevard, where the official shop is located.



New access 14

New LED Technology screens at the entrances to the changing rooms

Installation of new LED Technology screens to provide information to fans and visitors to the Stadium.

It has an individual screen for each of the sixteen changing rooms and three larger screens to broadcast events.



Rehabilitation of the Travessera front dividing building

Start of the third phase of the improvement project of the outside area of the Stadium. The dividing front of the Travessera de les Corts building was refurbished so it blends in aesthetically with the Auditorium and Social Space and is included in the project.



New facilities and audiovisual equipment in the Auditorium 1899

Giving the multi-purpose room the "Auditorium 1899" the permanent structure it required to cover the room's needs in various multi-disciplinary activities that may take place there: press releases, presentations, conferences, galas, etc.

The audiovisual system installed has audio systems, video, scenic lighting, a control room and centralised management. Automation and connections by mobile units.



New automatic vending machine area

Construction of boxes at the Passeig Boulevard to house various elements in the premises with a unified image (automatic vending machines, cash point, information point and the Nike store).



New restaurant outlets on the Passeig Boulevard

The construction of the new eatery area on the Passeig Boulevard responds to the Club's need to offer absolute comfort to the thousands of visitors to the Stadium during their time there. These will provide food, drink and ice-cream, among other snacks, in addition to the already existing offer.



Heating the Stadium's playing area

Heat radiation to the Stadium's playing area is installed through 30Km of underground piping. The boiler room is extended to accommodate the new installation. The purpose of heating the playing area is to maintain the roots and the grass at an average temperature of 12º to improve growth and maintain the grass in optimum conditions during the winter months.

The storage room is removed and the space is used to create a new technicians' changing room for Barça B, a video room and an office.



Refurbishing the School changing rooms



Joan Gamper Training Complex

New artificial grass pitches 5 and 6

Replacement of the artificial grass of pitches 5 and 6 with cutting-edge grass.



Extension of the dining-room, the living-room, extension of technicians' offices and refurbishment of the first team's changing rooms

Extension of the dining-room and creation of living areas, creating a new beam and slab floor in the stands. Refurbishment of the first team's changing rooms, changing the layout of the wash room area, toilets and showers. Extension of the technicians' offices to gain surface area over the stands.



New C6 Building

Consists of creating an extra level on the current C6 building to create a floor for changing rooms and offices.

The changing room programme occupies 80 metres of this floor, while the 20 remaining are technical areas and facilities. There is also a store room and public toilets.



New Handball / Futsal pavilions

Construction of the new indoor pavilions for the sports sections of FC Barcelona in the Sports City complex.

The two new pavilions are on two levels (one on top of the other) in a building located adjacent to the existing indoor sports pavilion and as a continuation of this building.

Access to the new pavilions (ffl 0.00 level) is from inside the Sports City, at pitch level of the upper pavilion (to coincide with the pitch level of the current pavilion), while the second pavilion is located on the basement level.



New conference room at the Masia

A conference room is created using the existing room. Three level tiers are constructed and a platform with a conference table. Includes 111 seats.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES 2013/14

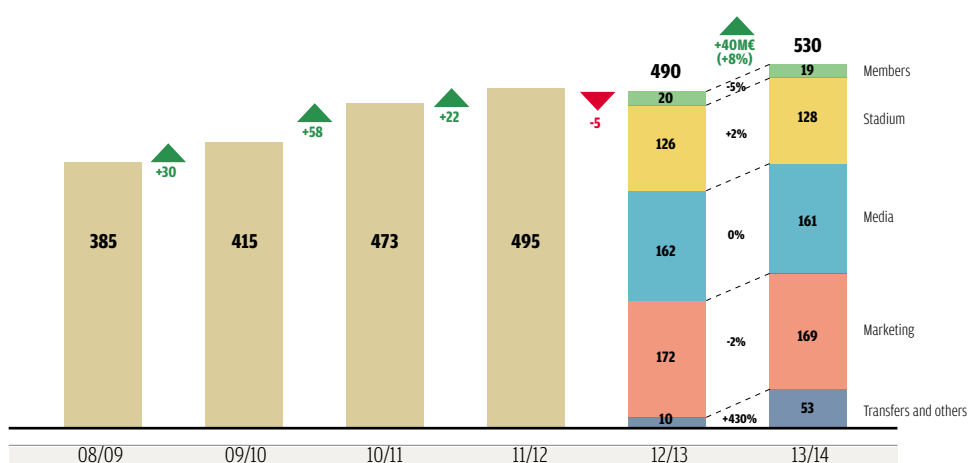
The summary of the annual accounts presented below is derived from the accounts audited by the company Deloitte, who have been auditors of FC Barcelona since the 2003/04 season. The audited accounts do not show any exceptions or uncertainties.

Revenue

- Football Club Barcelona closes the 13/14 season with revenues of 530 million Euros, considerably higher than the 490 million from the previous year (+8%) and the 509 budgeted (+4%).
- The main deviations compared to the previous year's figures are as follows:
 - Revenue from members decreased slightly (-2%) due to a drop in renewals, in particular resulting from the updating of the member census.
 - Income from the Stadium and the rest of the facilities increased by 2%. This is due basically to revenue from tickets to the King's Cup Final (not achieved last season) and an increase of revenue from the Museum and the new rental contract for the Store. It is negatively affected by a lower ticket revenue for the different competitions (Champions and Spanish Super Cup basically).
 - Marketing revenue is slightly lower (-2%), mainly due to the bonuses not paid for the titles not achieved, lower participation in income from licences and royalties of sports material and the decrease of revenue from the UEFA (quarter finals 13/14 vs semifinals in 12/13). These override the significant increase of sponsorship income for new sponsoring agreements and the significant revenues from the Asian tour in the summer 2013. There is a notable rise in income from the international area where new sponsorship agreements have been signed in the United States, in Asia, (China, Japan, Indonesia), the East (Saudi Arabia , Dubai) and Africa.
 - Income from transfers has increased significantly, this being the main positive deviation, due to the sale of the players Thiago, Cesc and Sanabria.

INCOME GROWTH

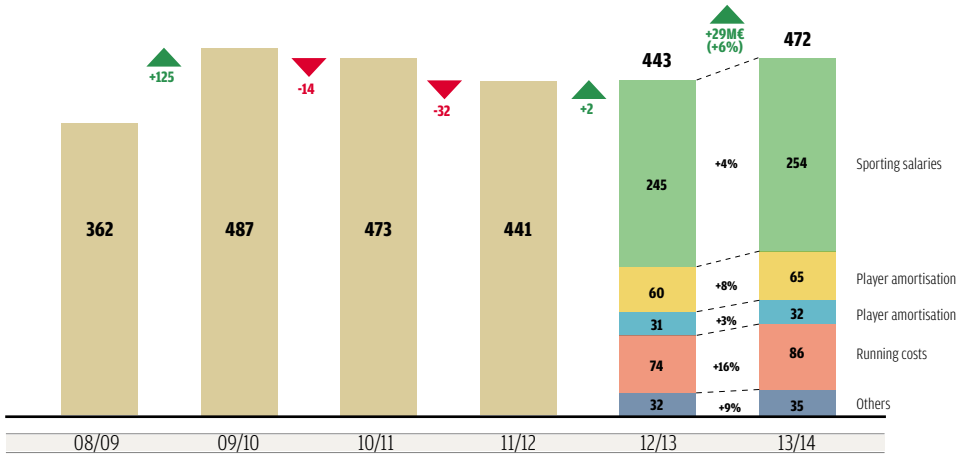
(Millions of Euros)



Expenses

- Operating expenses increased to a lesser degree than income, specifically by 7%, from 443 to 472 million Euros. The most notable entries are detailed below:
 - An increase of 5% in sports salaries, which would have been higher if the first football team had won the league title, as anticipated in the budget and as occurred in the real budget 2012/13. The increase includes the most important players of the first team as well as the exceptional fact of having two technical teams during the year.
 - Slight increase of the non-sports salary over inflation (+3%).
 - While keeping to the austerity policy initiated in 2010, management expenses have increased compared to the previous season with investments and significant expenses in the Sports City and the Les Corts facilities. Another important factor is the non-anticipated expenses deriving from the Cup Final and the New Espai Barça referendum.
 - Notable elements in the Others section include provisions for potential future risks, disposal of fixed assets and the sanction of 3.6 million imposed on the Club by the National Competition Commission as it considered that the audiovisual rights transfer contract signed with Mediapro during the previous mandate (June 2010) exceeded the maximum permitted according to the law. The 12/13 season, in the Others section, highlighted the impairments of the players Villa and Femenía.

(Millions of Euros)

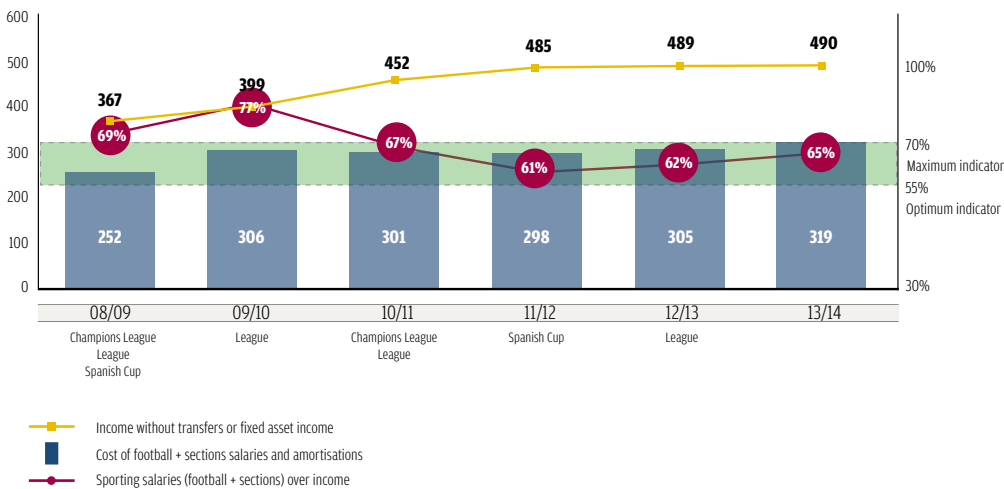


Sports costs evolution

- It must be emphasised that we consider the total salary payroll to be the total of sports salaries, which includes players' salaries, technical staff and bonuses for titles, image rights, sports agents, social security and all the amortizations of signings.
- For a clearer analysis, we have differentiated the figures, considering the total, (football and sections) and also considering only football (first team and youth, but without the sections).
- The percentage over income of the Total Club sports salary payroll (football + sections) increased 3 points , from 62% to 65% - this bearing in mind that the League was not won, if not the ratio would have gone up to 68%. If the analysis is limited only to football, the ratio increases by 2 points, from 55% to 57%. Keeping these levels stable and above the recommended 70% is crucial for the Club's future sustainability and special emphasis should be placed on this issue as the football market continues to be very inflationary.

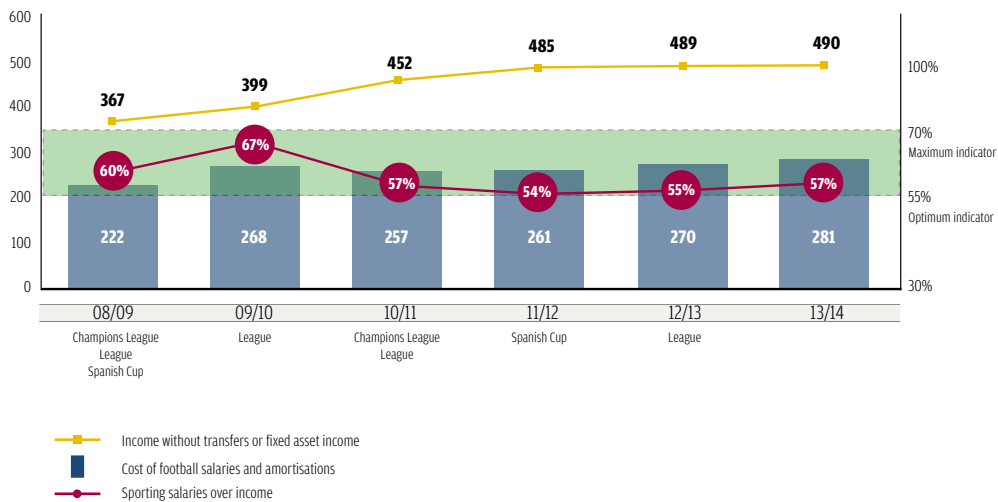
SPORTS COSTS OVER REVENUE

Results

- The year ends with an after tax profit of 41 million Euros. This is a 9 million increase compared to the 32 of the previous year and 5 million more than budget.
- At financial results level, the drop in interest rates and the reduction of the financial debt had a positive effect, as well as the obtaining of extraordinary financial revenues due to tax assessment interest returns in favour of the Club.

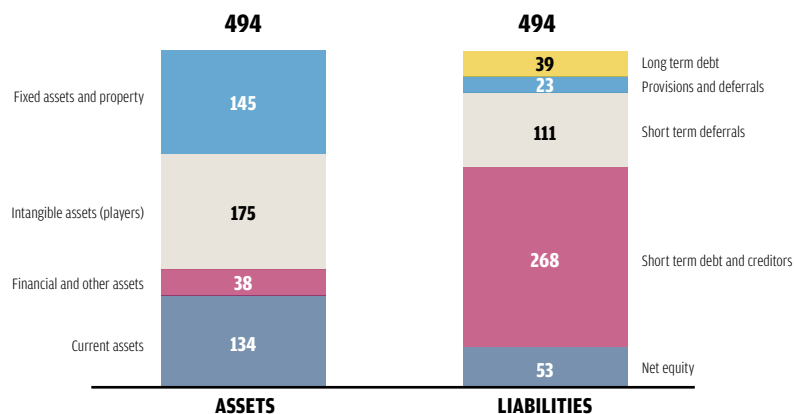

Balance sheet

- The results indicated above have enabled the net debt to be reduced by 44 million Euros (from 331 of the previous year to 287) despite investment in player acquisitions and the investment made into the continuous improvement of our facilities.
- It is still a high figure although it must be stressed that since the 10/11 season it has been reduced by 143 million Euros. According to the newly approved statutes, the net debt ratio over EBITDA for this season was set at a maximum of 3.0 and this has been met in full. The aim for the coming seasons is to continue reducing the debt, although for the 2014/15 season in particular and due to the exceptional investments in players in the first football team this summer, it is quite possible that the continued reduction of the last seasons might not be maintained.
- The net financial debt (loans + guarantees + deferred payment obligations for the purchase of players- liquid assets), is 76 million Euros and means the obligations derived from the syndicated loan agreement with the banks can be fully satisfied.
- At liquid assets level the Club ends the year with an available cash flow of 49 million Euros, having reduced the bank debt by 32 million (from the 104 of the previous year to 73), being up-to-date on 30 June with its obligations and having no outstanding debts to Public Administration.
- The working capital is negative but it must be remembered that in liabilities in the short-term credit policies have been included, renewable at over a year, and that at the end of June 2014 the Club has undrawn balances of these policies.
- It is also important to highlight that thanks to the profits accumulated over these last 4 financial years (113 million Euros) the Club has been able to reverse the Equity sign that has been negative since the close of 09/10 and now stands at 53 million Euros. This is a very significant point in terms of the Club's solidity and equity image.
- The Club's assets have been further strengthened, investing 18 million Euros in sports and social facilities, computer systems and other assets, a highlight of which is the new Sports City pavilion, the remodelling of access number 14 of the Stadium and part of the purchase of the future site for the Ministadium in Sant Joan Despí.

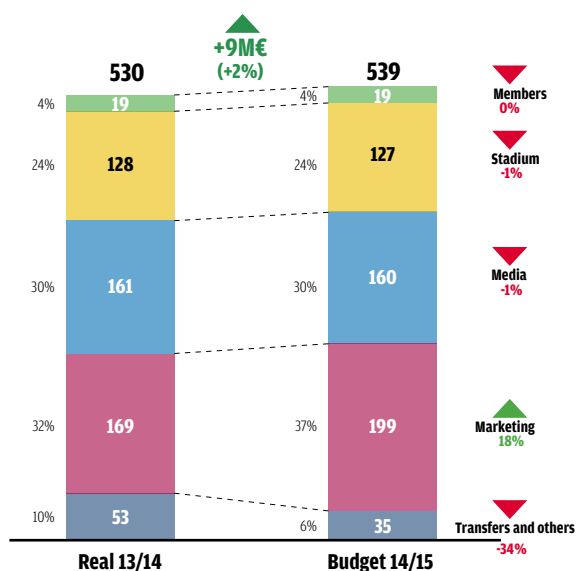

INCOME: BUDGET 14/15 VS REAL 13/14

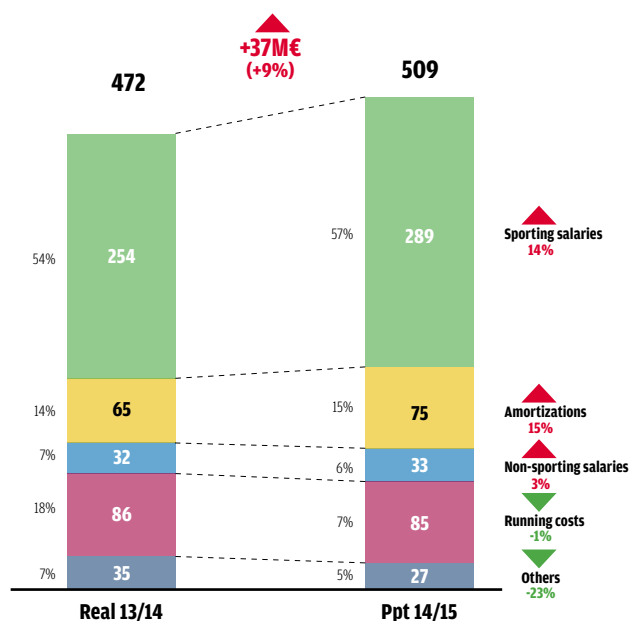

- Income increased by 2% to a historic maximum of 539 million Euros.
- The football sports budget, like every year, anticipates achieving the League championship, the quarter finals of the Champions League and the semifinals of the King's Cup.
- The revenue entry that has risen most is that of Marketing, in line with the continuous internationalisation of the brand in recent years and that anticipates a significant increase in the value of sponsorship agreements, setting a target increased figure of around 30 million Euro.
- Revenue from transfers went down as the previous season included the transfers of Thiago and Cesc while in the next season the only one recorded is that of Alexis.
- In terms of other income, there was a noteworthy reduction compared to the previous year due to not having made a summer tour (some friendlies in Europe vs Indonesia and Thailand in August 2013).
- The fact of not having won any national titles in 13/14 has a negative repercussion on income as the Spanish Super Cup was not played this summer and to a lesser degree the revenue sharing of the market pool by the UEFA to participants of the Champions League 14/15.

EXPENSES: BUDGET 14/15 VS REAL 13/14

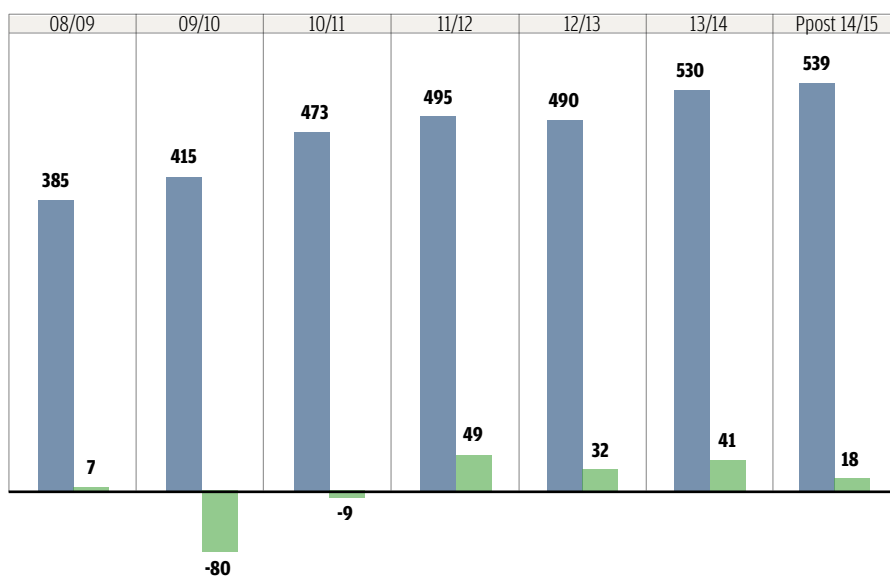

- Sports expenses increased compared to the previous year due to budgeting for the League title, the signings and renewals of the football first team and the greater cost of amortization payments of signed players.
- Non-sports salaries remained stable compared to the previous year.
- Maintaining the Club's austerity policy of the last few years, management expenses were reduced by -1% compared to the previous season.
- Contribution to the Foundation was kept at the same level as the previous season.
- Thus, the working capital budgeted for the season stands at 30 million Euros, which, including the financial result and taxes means an after tax profit of 18 million Euros.

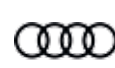
